RECOMMENDATION: The Council has several options, including:

BACKGROUND: In late 2015, representatives from Napa County Tobacco Education Program met with City officials and expressed the program's goal to implement smoke-free public parks within Napa County. The program obtained

public input through a "Smoke Free Parks Public Opinion Survey," which found the following –

- 96.7% of respondents felt that "tobacco litter in public parks is harmful to the environment.
- 94.3% of respondents felt that "tobacco use in public parks is harmful to your health or the health of your family."
- 86.5% of respondents would "support a policy to make Calistoga's public parks smoke free."

Follow Up to Council Meeting – September 20th, 2016

The Napa County Tobacco Education Program introduced the ordinance to City Council on Tuesday, September 20th, 2016. The presentation was well-received and Council did ask a few questions. First, Council asked whether or not this ordinance would restrict the use of marijuana in public parks. Under Health & Safety Code section 11326.3(a) –

- a. Individuals may not smoke marijuana in the following locations [in part]:
 - Any public place;
 - Anywhere smoking tobacco is prohibited;

Council also asked questions regarding enforcement and signage at public parks and suggested whether or not "public parks" would include parking lots at the parks. Council may determine whether or not to include public parking lots within this ordinance amendment.

<u>DISCUSSION</u>: This specific ordinance was not identified by the City Council as a priority project for Fiscal Year 2016-17; however, the larger Council Goal #4 of "Create an environmentally-sustainable community" does include an objective to "Implement green environmental sustainability policies and initiatives."

FISCAL IMPACT: If Council considers adopting the ordinance, park signs will need to be updated to reflect this change. Sign replacements are inexpensive and additional costs will be nominal.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-XXX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CALISTOGA AMENDING CHAPTER 12.24 TITLED "PARK RULES AND REGULATIONS" ADDING SECTIONS 12.24.040 TOBACCO USE IN CITY PARKS AND SECTION 12.24.041 TOBACCO USE IN CITY PARKS — ENFORCEMENT

WHEREAS, there are numerous scientific studies and data have suggested that secondhand tobacco smoke is a major cause of disease, including lung cancer, in non-smokers, with a heightened risk to the elderly, individuals with cardiovascular disease, and individuals with impaired respiratory function including asthmatics and those with obstructive airway disease; and

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency has classified secondhand tobacco smoke as a class A carcinogen known to cause cancer in humans; and

WHEREAS, in early 2006, following a comprehensive four year study the California Air Resources Board declared secondhand smoke a toxic air contaminant, which has been linked to 400 additional lung cancer deaths a year in non-smokers, 3,600 fatal heart attacks and 31,000 asthma attacks in children; and

WHEREAS, the list of health hazards associated with breathing secondhand tobacco smoke includes lung cancer, respiratory infection, decreased exercise tolerance, decreased respiratory function, bronchoconstriction and bronchospasm; and

WHEREAS, nonsmokers with allergies, respiratory ailments and others who suffer the ill effects of breathing secondhand smoke may experience a loss of job productivity or miss work because of the ill effects of tobacco on their health and higher costs to employers may result due to an increase in absenteeism, accidents, the cost of medical care, and loss of productivity; and

WHEREAS, in addition to these health hazards, smoking and the improper disposal of cigarettes is a documented environmental and fire hazard; and

WHEREAS, smokeless tobacco is not a safe alternative and causes its own share of death and disease including lung, larynx, esophageal, and oral cancer; and the regular use of snuff doubles the users risk of cardiovascular disease and death; and

WHEREAS, electronic cigarettes and similar nicotine delivery devices are not safe alternatives to smoking, of which the full health impacts are not completely known, although at minimum, the same adverse health effects from smoking are apparent; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby finds that smoking in public parks and associated facilities is a positive danger to health, and that prohibiting smoking in parks is thus necessary to preserve the public safety, health and welfare; and

WHEREAS, this Ordinance is exempt from environmental review pursuant to Sections 15301, 15304 and 15307 of the State Guidelines implementing the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, as amended ("CEQA"), because the adoption of smoking prohibited in all parks will not have a significant effect on the environment and therefor such action is exempt from CEQA review; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the City Council of the City of Calistoga on______, 2016, after due notice was given as required by law, at which time oral and documentary evidence was introduced to the City Council of the City of Calistoga; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has considered all information related to this matter, as presented at the public meeting of the City Council identified herein, including any supporting reports by City Staff, and any information provided during public meetings.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF CALISTOGA DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1

 Chapter 12.24 of the Calistoga Municipal Code titled "Park Rules and Regulations" is hereby amended by adding new section 12.24.040 to read as follows:

12.24.040 Tobacco use in City Parks

In City Parks and Recreation Facilities, the use of tobacco products including but not limited to cigarette smoking, use of electronic cigarettes or similar nicotine delivery devices and use of smokeless tobacco is prohibited. Parks and Recreation Facilities is defined as parks, landscaped trail areas, landscape areas proximate to recreation facilities including the Calistoga Community Pool, Calistoga Community Center, Monhoff Center, Pioneer Park and any other similar facilities.

In addition to common Municipal Code violation practices, violators of this chapter shall be referred to a local anti-smoking program.
