South Oak Street Public Access Easement Vacation and Realignment

**ISSUE:** Consideration of a Resolution approving a petition to vacate and realign an existing public pedestrian access easement located at 1722 Foothill Boulevard within the former South Oak Street right-of-way, between Myrtle Street and Foothill Boulevard, as marked and/or designated upon the "Morgan's Survey" recorded in the Napa County Recorders Office pursuant to Section 8300, et seq., of the California Streets and Highway Code.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt Resolution.

 **BACKGROUND:** On July 5<sup>th</sup>, 2006 the City Council adopted Resolution 2006-062 declaring its intent to vacate the existing S. Oak Street right-of-way, between Myrtle Street and Foothill Boulevard, and set a time and date for a hearing on the matter. On August 1, 2006 the City Council considered the matter and adopted Resolution 2006-68 determining that the portion of the S. Oak Street right-of-way was no longer needed for roadway purposes. However, the City Council did find the need to reserve a storm drainage easement since drainage facilities already existed. Additionally, the City Council also determined that a portion of the existing right-of-way would be useful as a nonmotorized transportation facility and further reserved a public pedestrian access easement, hereafter referred to as the "S. Oak Street Path," as shown on the attached *Exhibit 3 – Relocation of Pedestrian Easement*.

**<u>DISCUSSION:</u>** On February 2, 2011 the City received a request from the property owner at 1722 Foothill Boulevard, Robert Reichert to realign the S. Oak Street Path entirely within his property. Specifically, Mr. Reichert is requesting the S. Oak Street Path be relocated to run straight along his northwestern property line from Myrtle Street to Foothill Boulevard. Realigning the pathway would reduce an encumbrance on the property at 1805 Foothill

Boulevard, owner by Martha Naber and would lessen the conflict between the storm drain easement and the pedestrian easement.

To realign the S. Oak Street Path the City must vacate public access rights to the affected segment and the re-record public access rights over the realigned section, see Draft Resolution. These actions are necessary to comply with the procedural requirements of the California Government Code and Streets and Highways Code. These procedures are intended to provide the public with the notice and opportunity to comment on the proposed changes to the easement. Since the City Council previously adopted Resolution 2006-062 expressing its intentions to reserve a public pedestrian access easement no subsequent action is necessary to confirm the Council's intentions.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALISTOGA, COUNTY OF NAPA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, VACATING AND REALIGNING A TEN FOOT WIDE PUBLIC PEDESTRIAN ACCESS EASEMENT LOCATED SOLELY WITHIN THE PRIVATELY OWNED PROPERTY AT 1722 FOOTHILL BOULEVARD

WHEREAS, Robert Reichert, owner of the property located at 1722 Foothill Boulevard (APN 011-191-001) has filed a petition to vacate and realign the public pedestrian access easement located within the former South Oak Street right of way, between Myrtle Street and Foothill Boulevard, as marked and/or designated upon the "Morgan's Survey" recorded in the Napa County Recorders Office so that it is contained solely within his property along the northwestern property line; and

WHEREAS, these proceedings are pursuant to and in accordance with Section 8300, et seq., of the California Streets and Highway Code; and

WHEREAS, on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of February 2011, notices stating the time and place of the public hearing were posted along the area of the proposed vacation and realignment as required by California Streets and Highways Code Section 8323; and

**WHEREAS**, on the 18<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> days of February 2011, notices of the hearing were published in the Calistoga Tribune as required by California Streets and Highways Code Section 8322; and

WHEREAS, on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of March 2011, a public hearing on this matter was held; and

**WHEREAS**, the public pedestrian easement described in City Council Resolution 2006-068 is no longer needed for a present or prospective purpose once the ten foot wide pedestrian pathway is realigned in conformance with *Exhibit A – Public Pedestrian Access Easement*; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 892(a) of the California Streets and Highways Code, the City Council has determined that the realigned public pedestrian access easement is useful as a nonmotorized transportation facility and it is purpose of this reservation to ensure connectivity between residential districts; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Calistoga hereby finds that all of the findings contained in the staff report dated March 1, 2011 are true and correct and are hereby incorporated by this reference; and

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, as follows:

**SECTION 1**. The City Council of the City of Calistoga orders vacation of the public pedestrian easement described in City Council Resolution 2006-068 once a ten foot wide pedestrian pathway and its realignment and reservation in conformance with *Exhibit A – Public Pedestrian Access Easement*.

**SECTION 2**. The City Council of the City of Calistoga reserves a public pedestrian access easement in favor of the City and public agencies and private utility companies, and their respective agents, employees, and representatives, for purposes of construction, operation, maintenance, repair, removal and replacement of improvements for public pedestrian purposes, further described in the legal description set forth in Exhibit "A" of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Page 2 of 2 **SECTION 3.** This vacation and realignment is completed in accordance with the provisions of the California Streets and Highways Code, Part 3, "Public Street, Highways and Service Easements Vacation Law", Chapter 3, "General Vacation Procedure" and Sections 12.32 and 16.16.220 of the Calistoga Municipal Code. SECTION 4. Pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code Section 8325, the City Clerk shall cause a certified copy of this Resolution, attested by the Clerk under seal, to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder of the County of Napa. Upon such recordation, the vacation shall be complete. SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Resolution, and thenceforth and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect. #### **EXHIBIT "A"**

### **Public Pedestrian Access Easement**

Commencing at the intersection of the northeastern line of Foothill Boulevard (formerly Main Street) with the centerline of South Oak Street, said point lying between Blocks "D" and "E" as said streets and blocks are delineated on the "Map of Calistoga, Showing its Extensions, Surroundings and the Hot Sulphur Springs, Napa County, California" surveyed by T.W. Morgan and filed March 1, 1871 in The Office of the County Recorder of the County of Napa, State of California; thence along said centerline of South Oak Street North 23°44' East 240.00 feet more or less to the southwestern line of Myrtle Street; thence southeasterly along said southwestern line 10.00 feet; thence parallel with and distant 10.00 feet easterly of said centerline of South Oak Street South 23°44' West 240.00 feet more or less to said northeastern line of Foothill Boulevard; thence northwesterly along said northeastern line 10.00 feet to the point of commencement.
