It is important to recognize and award dedicated employees for their superior efforts on behalf of the City and Police Department. Although I am very proud of the work done by all members of the Department, and many of them are worthy of this award, I wish to single out one Officer and one Dispatcher for their excellent work as examples of the fine and dedicated staff of the Calistoga Police Department. I am pleased to continue the tradition of Officer and Dispatcher of the Year by selecting Officer Michael Perreault and Dispatcher/Community Services Technician Douglas O'Neill as Calistoga Police Department Officer and Dispatcher for 2010.

**Officer Michael Perreault** constantly displays a strong commitment to professionalism and proactive policing. Last year, Mike made 106 arrests, one quarter of all arrests made by the Police Department for the year. Included in these cases were 25 drunk driving arrests, an accomplishment that brought recognition from MADD for his efforts against drunk driving. This is Mike's third consecutive year being honored by MADD. He has been involved in several significant and complicated cases including a burglary investigation involving several jurisdictions resulting in the apprehension two suspects, domestic violence calls, and sexual assault cases.

On October 4, 2010 at almost 11:00 pm Mike noticed a car stopped on the side of the highway with it engine running. Mike took the initiative to check the car and found the driver had just suffered a stroke. Mike immediately summoned EMS and the driver was transported to the hospital. It was acknowledged that only because of Mike's action that the driver survived.

**Dispatcher/ Community Policing Technician Douglas O'Neill** has been with the Department since June of 1970. After a long and distinguished career, Doug decided to come back for more. Since retirement, he has worked as a Community Policing Technician and Part-Time Dispatcher. Doug's knowledge of, and care for the City of Calistoga has benefitted all of his co-workers. Doug has

made himself available to help out at all hours of the day or night especially helping out with computer issues.

In this last year Doug worked tirelessly during our transition between computerized record systems. He made sure that all of our old records and reports were successfully carried over into the new system, quality checked the data obsessively, entered streets, addresses, and codes into the new system and verified that it all worked correctly on our equipment. Without his efforts the transition would not have been so seamless.
