MINUTES CITY COUNCIL – REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, APRIL 19, 2011 - 7:00 P.M. CALISTOGA COMMUNITY CENTER

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Gingles called the Regular Session to order at 7:05 p.m.

In attendance were the following: Councilmember Chris Canning, Councilmember Gary Kraus, Vice Mayor Michael Dunsford, and Mayor Jack Gingles. Councilmember Karen Slusser was absent.

Also present were Public Works Director/City Engineer Dan Takasugi, Administrative Services Director Bill Mushallo, City Manager Richard Spitler, and City Clerk Susan Sneddon.

ACTION OUT OF CLOSED SESSION

Mayor Gingles announced that there was no action out of Closed Session held this evening.

ADOPTION OF MEETING AGENDA

2. Proclamation regarding the 21st annual Nob Hill car show and 1000-mile tour.

Mayor Gingles read the proclamation.

PRESENTATION

3. Presentation by Yvonne Henry, the City's representative on the Napa County Arts and Culture Commission.

Yvonne Henry, the City's representative on the Napa County Arts and Culture Commission, provided an update on the Commission. She stated that on May 2, 2011 the Commission will be meeting at the Sharpsteen Museum at 4 PM.

4. Presentation of emergency preparedness and Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program by Joe Russo.

Joe Russo, Fire Fighter, presented a brief introduction of the CERT program; the next 20-hour training program will be held at Rancho de Calistoga Mobilehome Park starting May 16, 2011.

Councilmember Kraus stated that he recently rode the Napa Valley Transit bus from Calistoga to the Napa County Airport; he was glad to see so many morning commuters helping to decrease the number of automobiles on the roads, and doing their part in reducing the green house gas emissions.

5. Minutes of the April 5, 2011 City Council meeting.

It was MOVED by Councilmember Canning and SECONDED by Councilmember Kraus to approve *Item No. 5* on the Consent Calendar.

GENERAL GOVERNMENT

6. Consideration of a Resolution Rescinding Resolution No. 2011-042 that authorizes the City Manager to provide matching funds up to \$15,000 in CDBG Low Income Housing Program Funds for each Mobile Home Park Association involved in a rent dispute associated with the Rent Stabilization Ordinance.

City Manager Spitler introduced this item. He stated that the City Attorney has recommended that the City not grant up to \$15,000 in the former California Statewide Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the Low Income Housing Program for the mobile home park associations going through the arbitration process; this is because the City has an administrative role in the Rent Stabilization Ordinance (RSO) process, and should not fund the mobile home parks associations in this dispute because it could affect the validity of the due process under the RSO.

Don Holinsworth, 919 Champagne Circle South, thanked City Manager Spitler and the City Council in attempting grant funds to each mobile home park association going through the arbitration process.

It was MOVED by Mayor Gingles and SECONDED by Vice Mayor Dunsford to adopt Resolution No. 2011-044 rescinding Resolution No. 2011-042 that authorizes the City Manager to provide matching funds up to \$15,000 in CDBG Low Income Housing Program Funds for each Mobile Home Park Association involved in a rent dispute associated with the Rent Stabilization Ordinance. The Motion was carried as follows:

7. Presentation on the Audited Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) for Fiscal Year 2009/2010 and to receive and file report.

Terry Krieg, CPA, presented the City's independent audit for Fiscal Year 2009/2010 with an unqualified opinion of the City financial statements.

The Council praised Mr. Krieg for a complete report, and a very clear presentation; Council received the report.

8. Status of the Calistoga Transit Plan Update (Oral Communication).

Public Works Director/City Engineer Takasugi provided background information and a brief report on the status of updating the Napa County Transportation and Planning Agency's (NCTPA) Transit Plan. He stated that NCTPA provides the HandyVan service to the City, and it is the City's intent to work with NCTPA to improve the service.

CITY MANAGERS REPORT

City Manager Spitler reported on the following:

- Calistoga Junior/Senior High School held the "Every 15 Minutes" event to address teenage drunk driving;
- May 1st is the Calistoga Tamale Festival;
- May 2nd is the final Rancho de Calistoga Mobile Home Park Arbitration hearing;
- Washington Street/North Oak intersection is being reconstructed to a 3way stop with crosswalk.
