BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

In order to comply with the conditions of approval and terms of the Development Agreement for the Palisades Resort and Spa Project (Solage), various public infrastructure improvements have been constructed. Improvements include both on-site and off-site public water, sanitary sewer, recycled water, and drainage facilities. A portion of these improvements directly and solely benefit the Solage development project,

while other improvements, or portions thereof, provide benefit to parcels beyond the Solage project limits.

In order to begin to establish the mechanism to fund the public improvements that benefit others, a reimbursement agreement was outlined within the Solage project Development Agreement (DA). Although the DA does not address any of the specifics of a reimbursement agreement, it recognizes the benefit of some of the public improvements to certain surrounding properties and the appropriateness for reimbursement of some of the improvement costs by the other benefited properties.

An agreement with Coastland was approved by City Council on May 15, 2007 to develop the Area of Benefit and Reimbursement Program in the amount of \$55,608. That agreement included an analysis of the improvements that are subject to reimbursement and an assessment of which parcels benefit from such improvements. In addition, a thorough evaluation has been conducted to determine whether the developer's actual costs exceeded those that the City might reasonably expect to pay to install those improvements itself. As such, the City requested that the scope include a comparison of recent, similar public improvements costs. The expected costs are being reviewed against the developer's actual costs in order to determine which costs are allowable for reimbursement. Ultimately, the allowable costs will be applied to the actual eligible improvements, leading to a final cost 'pool' that will be distributed to the other benefited parcels.

Coastland's costs to perform the work necessary to determine the area of benefit has exceeded the contract. There are several contributing factors as explained below:

Although the Solage resort itself opened in June 2007, certain of the public improvements were not completed until August 2008.

It was anticipated that the as-built drawings of project improvements would be submitted to Coastland all at once, and that the quantity take-offs and determination of comparable City costs could be performed for all of the reimbursable improvements efficiently and at the same time. This was not the case. As-built drawings for various improvements were submitted in four separate transmittals from August 2008 through March 2009. Also, the Silverado Trail Water Main comparable City costs were prepared separately from the rest of the improvements.

The Developer was to submit both detailed and summarized cost information with supporting documentation in a format that allowed a relatively efficient audit of their actual costs. While that information has now been summarized, the process required multiple iterations of review and requests for additional information to obtain adequate supporting

documentation to confirm that the submitted costs were in fact incurred. Many cost items required further information to confirm that they were associated with reimbursable improvements identified in the Development Agreement. Further, the Developer was not able to produce any signed change orders or progress payments for the work, which increased the amount of review necessary to confirm costs.

The initial Coastland proposal was prepared based on an anticipated seven to nine months completion schedule. However, the project has now been worked on, intermittently, for thirty-three months.

Following is an outline (as provided by Coastland) of the work remaining and the estimated costs to complete the work:

Staff has reviewed the proposal and recommends approval of Amendment No. 2 to the contract with Coastland Civil Engineering. Staff has met with Solage Calistoga representatives to discuss this amendment and the steps necessary to complete this work. Solage Calistoga has agreed with the necessity for this amendment and has already submitted the necessary funds to complete the project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This contract will be paid for by the developer of the Palisades (Solage) Project through a Developer Deposit Account. Developer funds are available to complete the project.

WHEREAS, in order to comply with conditions of approval and terms of the Development Agreement for the Palisades Resort and Spa (Solage), various public improvements including both on-site and off-site public water, sanitary sewer, recycled water, and drainage facilities have been constructed; and

WHEREAS, a portion of these public improvements provide benefits to other parcels and areas beyond the Solage project limits; and

WHEREAS, the Solage project Development Agreement recognized the appropriateness for a Reimbursement Program to provide funding for the portions of the public improvements that benefit others; and

WHEREAS, City Council approved an agreement with Coastland Civil Engineering in the amount of \$55,608 on May 15, 2007, for pertinent engineering services to the Reimbursement Program; and

WHEREAS, City Council approved Amendment No. 1 to the agreement with Coastland Civil Engineering in the amount of \$23,366 on April 10, 2010; and

WHEREAS, additional engineering services are required to complete the project; and

WHEREAS, staff has requested and received a proposal from Coastland Civil Engineering to complete the additional engineering services (attached) in the amount of \$12,500; and

WHEREAS, staff has reviewed the proposal and recommends that Amendment No. 2 to the Professional Services Agreement with Coastland Civil Engineering, Inc. be approved in the amount of \$12,500; and

WHEREAS, the cost of Amendment No. 2 to the Agreement has been accepted and paid for by the Solage project owner, by way of a Developer Deposit Account.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Calistoga approves the attached Amendment No. 2 to the Professional Services Agreement with Coastland Civil Engineering, Inc. for development of an Area of Benefit and Reimbursement Program for the Palisades Resort and Spa (Solage) Project in an amount not to exceed \$12,500; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is authorized to execute the agreement contingent upon approval of the City Attorney.
