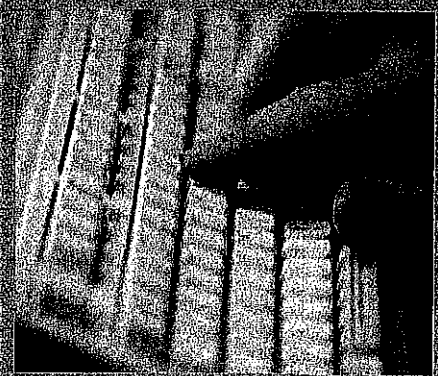

Cooking Club Recipe/ Receta: Chilaquiles a la "Leon"

Recipe written by 8th Period Participant Daniela Leon and her father.

In a pot boil the tomatoes, peppers, and add extra spicy peppers as desired. After they have softened, carefully pour boiled contents into blender and add garlic cloves, oregano, and a pinch of cumin, and salt & pepper. Blend all ingredients until a nice thick sauce is made. *Make sure to taste! Chop up tortillas into squares and deep fry until they are hard & golden brown. Remove excess oil and add whipped eggs to tortillas chips. When the egg is fully cooked, add the sauce to the pan. Cook for a while on medium heat and make sure sauce doesn't burn out! * Bonus: You can sprinkle Queso Fresco or Sour Cream on top!

En una olla hierva con los tomates, los chiles y picantes adicionales los deseads. Después de haber suavizado, pon todo en la licuadora y añadir dientes de ajo, el oregano y una pizca de comino y sal y pimienta. Mezcla todos los ingredientes hasta obtener una salsa espesa que se haga agradable. Come las tortillas en cuadrados y refr hasta que estén duras y doradas. Retire el exceso de aceite y añade los huevos batidos a los chips de tortillas. Cuando el huevo este completamente cocido, añadir la salsa a la sartén. Cocine por un rato a fuego medio y asegure que no se quemel. *Bono: se puede espolvorear queso fresco o crema agria.

- * 2-3 Large Tomatoes/ Jitomates
- * Corn Tortillas / Maiz
- * 2-3 Whipped Eggs/ Huevos batidos
- * "Huajillo" dried peppers
- * Couple Garlic Cloves/ ajo
- * A dash of Oregano
- * A dash of Cumin/ Comino
- * Salt & Pepper to taste/ Sal y Pimienta


