2. Presentation by Lynn Brown, City's representative on the Napa County Local Food Advisory Council.

Lynn Brown, City's representative on the Napa County Local Food Advisory Council, stated that the County Food Council is working towards educating the public, and establishing rules and regulations for each jurisdiction in the County on food production issues. He stated that they are hosting an educational food forum at the Yountville Community Center which will provide an opportunity for the public to explore and celebrate the abundance of locally grown food.

 - **Councilmember Kraus** stated concerns regarding the cost for the Interim Administrative Services Director's services. He requested that the proposed Resolution include the wording "not to exceed" \$15,000.
 - **City Manager Spitler** stated that the initial budget for the Interim Administrative Services Director was \$30,000, however an extension is needed to provide transition services for the new Administrative Services Director.
 - It was MOVED by Councilmember Kraus and SECONDED by Vice Mayor Dunsford to adopt the revised <u>Resolution No. 2010-102</u> approving an extension of the professional services agreement with Spilman and Associates in the amount of \$15,000 (including "not to exceed" \$15,000);

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PUBLIC HEARING

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6. Review of the Draft General Plan Amendments implementing the Urban Design Plan.

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Planning and Building MacNab provided a brief history regarding the City's Urban Design Plan which was adopted in January 2010. He stated that the next step is to receive Council direction to proceed with implementation of the Urban Design Plan (UDP). He stated that the proposed amendments primarily focus on the Character Area chapter of the Urban Design Plan. He stated that the implementation of Character Areas into General Plan will require amendments in three elements (Land Use, Community Identity, and Circulation). He stated that the proposed amendments would establish a new Character Overlay Designation that will set forth specific land use design and development suggestions, criteria, and guidelines for development. He stated that as part of the implementation the Bounsall and Myrtle Springs Planned Development Overlays will be integrated into the respective Character Areas. He stated that there would also be modifications to the Bicycle Circulation Map. He stated that on August 24, 2011 the Planning Commission held a public hearing primarily focused on the integration of the UDP into the General Plan; general support was received from the public on the proposed approach for implementing the UDP and that the Planning Commission supports implementation of the UDP into the General Plan as proposed. He noted that staff has received several requested changes which are discussed in the staff report.

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Mayor Gingles opened the public hearing.

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Carolynne Wilkinson-Clair, Doctor Wilkinson's Hot Springs Resort owner, asked for clarification of a portion of the Urban Design Plan that applies to her property.

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Chris Ciriacks, 1801 Foothill Blvd, stated concerns about a pedestrian and bicycle path overlay for a pedestrian and bicycle path in the Urban Design Plan, and how it might affect her property.

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Kristin Casey, 1132 Denise Drive, stated that she provided a communication to Council regarding this item. She suggested verbiage be added to the UDP

regarding the Highway 29 entrance to Calistoga, and she also stated concerns regarding circulation and parking.

Jeff Bounsall, 414 Foothill Blvd, stated concerns with the proposed amendment to the UDP in that it will affect his proposed project.

Mayor Gingles closed the public hearing.

Councilmember Slusser suggested a number of revisions to the proposed amendments be considered. After deliberation, the Council did not support requested revisions to language addressing the Bounsall property, parking requirements and modifications to the planned bike path along the Napa River.

Planning and Building MacNab asked if Council has any concerns about the recommended revisions proposed by the Planning Commissions as outlined in the staff report, and if Council supports the recommendations provided by Kristin Casey (<u>Communication A</u>). He also asked if Council supports Councilmember Slusser's recommendation that certain areas of the Napa River Bicycle Path be removed from the Bicycle Plan and the General Plan.

There was Council consensus to not support Kristin Casey's suggestion as propose in Communication A. In addition Council does not support changing the current language regarding the Bicycle Plan in the General Plan.

Planning and Building MacNab stated that he would meet with Councilmember Slusser to go over the remaining suggestions she has regarding in the UDP.

There was Council consensus to incorporate the Planning Commissions recommendations into the final version of the UDP. Staff will prepare a final draft of General Plan amendments in accordance with Council direction; prepare environmental document; and return to the Planning Commission and the City Council for formal adoption proceedings early in 2012.

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8. Consideration of a Resolution implementing a program for inspection and repair of sidewalk trip hazards throughout the City.

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218 219 Public Works Director/City Engineer Takasugi introduced this item, and provided background information. He stated that the program to inspect and repair the City sidewalk trip hazards will be implemented in phases. He stated that Public Agency Risk Sharing Authority of California (PARSAC) strongly recommended that the City implement a sidewalk inspection program to reduce the number of sidewalk trip hazards. He stated the plan is to initiate sidewalk inspections and City-funded repairs of smaller trip hazards; with larger trip hazards a notice to replace the sidewalk using a fifty-fifty cost share with the property owner up to \$1,000. If the property owner refuses, then the City must make the repairs and assess a lien on the property.

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It was MOVED by Vice Mayor Dunsford and SECONDED by Councilmember Kraus to adopt the revised <u>Resolution No. 2010-104</u> implementing a program for inspection and repair of sidewalk trip hazards throughout the City.
