Comment Box Responses

May 26^{th} – June 10th

There are too many rules at this pool.

We agree that there are a lot of rules at this pool. Our rules follow suggested safety guidelines set by the American Red Cross. Our first concern is patron safety at all times. If you have any questions about a particular rule, please feel free to ask any guard for a detailed explanation. Enjoy the summer!

Please make the water temperature cooler. It is much to hot when I swim laps.

We strive to keep the water temperature at 84 degrees. Sometimes the water does get warmer during the summer months naturally, but we try to keep it on target. If the pool is running particularly warm, we will leave the covers off at night. Thank you!

Why is the pool not getting covered at night? Please have the guards cover it so it is not cold in the morning. Thanks.

We actually have been covering the pools almost every night so far this year. The exception to this rule has been if the pool has needed to be fully vacuumed by our staff early in the morning. Our goal has been to really give pool cleaning and weekly maintenance a priority. We try to coordinate our cleaning days to correspond to a warm night. The other reason the pool might not be covered overnight is if the water temperature is above 84 degrees. We strive to keep as constant as possible for the enjoyment of all our patrons. Thank you!

Comment Box Responses

June 11th - June 22nd

Why can't we bring floating devices into the pool?

We do not allow floating devices such as life jackets to be worn in the pool because it typically gives children a false sense of security and the child ends up wondering into deeper water than they can actually swim in. Life jackets can be dangerous if not properly fitted and sized. The wearer has to be strong enough to tilt the head back to avoid going face-down in the pool. Often children are not strong enough to stay face-up. We want individuals to stay in an appropriate depth of water for their swimming skills.

Why do you encourage showering before entering the pool?

We encourage showering before entering the pool so that our facility stays as clean as possible. A quick rinse before entering the water goes a long way to clean off any dirt or bacteria that is on your body. You shower to remove perspiration from your body along with perfume, deodorant and other substances we might put on our body.

I was here and the pool was at capacity, so we were not allowed in. What determines capacity?

For safety reasons, we have 1 guard per every 20 people. Occasionally, depending on the swimming skills of the people at the pool and the experience of the lifeguards working, that ratio changes slightly. We apologize for the wait to get in to the facility. Safety is always our first priority. Thank you!

June 23rd – July 11th

Why can't we have toys in the pool?

We do not allow floating toys such noodles, blow-up lounge chairs or lifejackets to be used in the pool because they typically give children a false sense of security and the child ends up wondering into deeper water than they can actually swim in. We do not allow hard toys in the pool because they are dangerous when thrown. We do allow soft toys in the pool as long as they are not posing a danger to others.

Can you require people to shower before entering the pool?

We are not allowed to require people shower, but we do encourage showering before entering the pool so that our facility stays as clean as possible. A quick rinse before entering the water goes a long way to clean off any dirt or bacteria that is on your body. You shower to remove perspiration from your body along with perfume, deodorant and other substances we might put on our body.

I was here and the pool was at capacity, so we were not allowed in. What determines capacity?

For safety reasons, we have 1 guard per every 20 people. Occasionally, depending on the swimming skills of the people at the pool and the experience of the lifeguards working, that ratio changes slightly.
