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BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

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replace or rehabilitate public highway bridges over waterways, other topographical barriers, other highways, or railroads when the State and the Federal Highway Administration determine that a bridge is significantly important and is unsafe because of structural deficiencies, physical deterioration, or functional obsolescence.

Reimbursable scopes of work include replacement, rehabilitation, painting, scour countermeasure, bridge approach barrier and railing replacement, low water crossing replacement, and ferry service replacement. About \$240 million of federal funds are made available to local agencies annually. The federal reimbursement rate is 88.53% of the eligible participating project costs including preliminary engineering, right of way, and construction costs.

The HBP grant program pays for 88.53% of the total project cost, including environmental clearance, design and construction. The remaining 11.47% must utilize local matching funds. For certain bridges that are identified as "off-system" bridges (typically on local or rural roads) the local 11.47% funding match may utilize bridge toll credits, thus enabling cities to rehabilitate or replace certain bridges at no cost. The bridge toll credit grant program is actually undersubscribed.

Calistoga has two bridges that are eligible for participation in the HBP. These bridge structures are:

Bridge No. 21C0115 Berry Street over Napa River, built in 1919. Structural Deficiency rating of 23.1.

• Bridge No. 21C0103 Grant Street over Garnett Creek, built in 1918. Structural Deficiency rating of 41.0.

Of the two bridges, Berry Street is an "off-system" bridge structure and is eligible for bridge toll credits.

When staff became aware of this opportunity to obtain full funding for bridge replacement, staff notified Council in an August 28, 2012 memo of its intent to pursue an application for an HBP grant. The grant application was submitted to MTC in early September 2012. The application was submitted for funding under an amendment to the 2011 TIP (Transportation Improvement Plan), which is attached to SAFETEA-LU Act funding.

Staff did not make application for the Grant Street bridge over Garnett Creek, since it would have required an 11.47% local match, for which funding is not currently foreseeable in the near future. 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Staff learned that our HBP grant application for the Berry Street Bridge was approved by MTC on December 19, 2012, per 2011 TIP Amendment #11-31 (excerpt attached). Approval by FHWA (Federal Highway Administration) and Caltrans is expected, but has not been formalized. More formal notification will come out in a 2011 TIP amendment. A Request for Authorization (RFA) package is required to proceed with preliminary engineering.

Staff recommends City Council authorize the City Manager to request authorization of the HBR funding (upon formal grant approval from FHWA and Caltrans) for preliminary engineering and approve the budget adjustment to recognize the additional revenue and the corresponding expenditure for this project during FY 2012/13.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Fiscal Year 2012/13 General Fund Capital Improvement Program did not anticipate this program funding. As such, this budget adjustment seeks to increase the program funding and appropriations to account for this HBR grant by \$319,000 if the grant funding is approved by FHWA and Caltrans. The HBR grant program does not require any matching funds for this project.

 Staff anticipates that this project may require a significant amount of Public Works staff time. Some of this staff impact may need to be outsourced, due to lack of staff resources in Public Works. This is particularly the case, since the Caltrans Division of Local Agency Assistance has been essentially eliminated and the complexities of Federal Aid grant projects may exceed staff's ability to manage.
