**Mayor Gingles** presented a twenty-five year appreciation award to Police Officer Gary Enyart. Gary Enyart accepted the award.

3) Presentation by Peggy McCormick from the American Cancer Society. (This item was added to the agenda and was to be heard prior to Item No. 2)

**Peggy McCormick**, spoke on behalf of the American Cancer Society and is the Event Chair for the Relay for Life in St. Helena this year. She stated that the event will take place in St. Helena the weekend of July 13-14, 2013. She stated that their goal is to partner with the City of Calistoga and switch off holding the event at both locations. Ms. McCormick discussed last year's Relay for Life event and discussed this year's goals for fundraising.

He stated that Karen Murphy, City 168 Attorney, who was assigned to this project, is here for discussion. He stated that 169 170 John Tuteur, Napa County Registrar, is also present to present the Referendum

City Manager Spitler stated that on August 21, 2012 the City Council approved

the Enchanted Resorts Project. Subsequently, on September 20, 2012 a Referendum Petition was submitted requesting that the General Plan Amendment portion of the approval be rescinded. He stated that it takes 213 signatures to qualify the Referendum Petition, and 347 signatures of those obtained were verified. He said that the Council has two options: 1) after the Public Hearing Council can choose to repeal the General Plan Amendment Resolution or 2) submit the Resolution to the voters either at the next regular Municipal Election in November 2014, or at a Special Election which is no sooner than 88 days after the order by the City Council to have a Special Election. He said that staff has reviewed the material and is recommending that the Council submit the Resolution to the voters at a Special Election to be held March 5, 2013. He discussed the preparation of ballot arguments.

**John Tutuer, Napa County Registrar of Voters,** discussed the sufficiency of the Referendum Petition. He requested that the Council adopt a motion accepting the County Certification so that Council can then take subsequent motion. He also discussed the costs of a Special Election should one be held.

Mayor Gingles opened the Public Hearing at 8:04 PM.

**Cara O'Neill, Diamond Mountain Road**, expressed her thoughts and support for the Indian Springs Expansion project. She discussed her concerns with how the conversations took place in regards to the Enchanted Resorts project and asked Council to rescind Resolution No. 2012-062.

**Dawnine Dyer, 1501 Diamond Mountain Road**, asked that the Council rescind Resolution No. 2012-062 and explained her reasoning.

**Norma Tofanelli, 1001 Dunaweel Lane**, spoke regarding the November 6, 2012 General Municipal Election results. She discussed the significance of the results and asked why this Public Hearing is not taking place at the next Council meeting where a new City Council will be seated.

**Dennis McNay, 2653 Foothill Blvd.**, discussed the three proposed resorts and suggested that solar items be installed at all of the resorts to assist in making Calistoga "green".

Mayor Gingles closed the public hearing at 8:18 p.m.

He discussed the permissible uses of COPS grant funds which include: funding additional police officers; overtime to increase police service; civilian personnel when the civilian employee performs duties which will free police officers to perform law enforcement duties; and to purchase equipment that will benefit "front line law enforcement". He stated that COPS funding is critical to the function of the department and Calistoga has been using it consistently in the past and proposed to use it again this year for the following purposes:

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\$12,500 to fund the Juvenile Diversion Program

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\$32,000 to fund two part-time Community Service Officer positions

161 162 \$8,400 for Livescan fingerprinting machine service contract \$43,000 to assist in funding fourth full-time Dispatcher

8) General Plan Annual Report

Planning & Building Director Goldberg presented the item and discussed the Calistoga General Plan and its progress made toward implementation during 2012. Larry Kromann, 19 Rockrose Lane, spoke on behalf of Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc. and stated that CAH does provide a report once the work has been completed. He stated that CAH does pull building permits for these projects. He said their volunteer base is very good. He also stated that this year the majority of their funding sources either postponed until later in the year, or they have not responded, which has put them in a difficult position and that is why he has come to the City requesting the money in advance.

Council discussion ensued.

It was MOVED by Vice Mayor Dunsford and SECONDED by Councilmember Barnes to adopt Resolution No. 2013-025 approving a fiscal year 2012/13 budget adjustment to appropriate funds in the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) from the City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund 78 for the City's contribution to the 2013 Rebuilding Calistoga Program and authorizing the City Manager to enter into an Amendment No. 2 to the Funding Agreement with Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc, for the 2013 Rebuilding Calistoga Program.
