# **ISSUE:**

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Consideration of a Resolution approving Amendment No. 5 to the Professional Services Agreement with Larry Walker Associates for ongoing permit assistance services related to the City's current Wastewater Treatment Plant NPDES permit and the State's General Water Reuse Permit in the amount of \$59,810.

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# **RECOMMENDATION:**

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Adopt a Resolution.

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# BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

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The City of Calistoga Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) was issued a revised National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit (NPDES Permit) in November, 2010, by the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB). Under this permit, the City may discharge treated effluent to the Napa River during the wet season (October 1st through May 15th) as long as specific

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dilution requirements in the river are met. During the remainder of the year, river discharge is prohibited and all effluent produced at the WWTP must be stored or recycled.

The monitoring and reporting requirements associated with the City's WWTP NPDES permit have become more onerous and complex, and the RWQCB has imposed mandatory fines for certain permit violations. LWA is very familiar with our current permit and the regulatory requirements imposed by the Board. Since January of 2001, LWA has been providing ongoing assistance related to the City's permit monitoring and reporting requirements. LWA's costs vary each year depending on the City's needs for consultants expertise related to regulatory compliance. Their costs over the last several years have varied from 11K to 51K.

LWA is also providing regulatory assistance to the City of Calistoga on updating its Recycled Water Use Program to be consistent with conditions specified in the State's General Water Reuse Permit. In May of 2005, the RWQCB and the State Department of Health Services granted the City formal approval to operate its recycled water program under the State's General Water Reuse Permit. The General Water Reuse Permit delegates regulatory authority to the City, and requires the City to monitor and report all activities utilizing recycled water within its jurisdiction.

Staff requested and received from LWA a proposal to provide additional ongoing permit assistance for both the WWTP NPDES Permit and the General Water Reuse Permit. Following are some of the tasks that LWA will be providing (additional tasks are in italics):

## Preparation of Regulatory Compliance Reports

In the past City staff prepared draft compliance reports and LWA provided review and comment to ensure regulatory and policy requirements were addressed properly. For FY 2013/14, the City is requesting LWA prepare draft versions of compliance reports for City review and comment. This approach will reduce City staff time spent on reporting obligations and allow the City to dedicate its full resources to facility operations.

#### Pollution Prevention Assistance

 The City is required to undertake pollution prevention activities to reduce the amount of pollutants received at the WWTP. Current pollutants of concern are mercury, boron, antimony, cyanide, chlorodibromomethane, dichlorobromomethane, ammonia, copper, oil and grease, and PCBs. LWA will provide advice to the City when identifying and implementing appropriate pollution prevention activities. LWA will prepare a draft 2013 Annual Pollution Prevention Report that will be submitted to

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64 City staff for review and approval before finalizing for submittal to the Regional 65 Water Board.

### Sanitary Sewer Management Plan (SSMP) Internal Audit

The Regional Water Board requires that all agencies serving more than 2,500 people complete an SSMP internal audit by May 1, 2014. LWA will assist the City in preparing an internal audit report by the assigned deadline. LWA will review the City's current SSMP and work with City staff to evaluate the SSMP effectiveness (e.g., compile metrics such as miles of televised pipe, number of spills/volumes from year to year, etc.) and the City's compliance status with each of the required SSMP elements. LWA will analyze, tabulate, and graph historical information on the program metrics and also evaluate the SSMP for compliance with all the required elements. LWA will prepare a list of deficiencies and opportunities for improving the SSMP, if any are identified. LWA will prepare a draft report of the findings for the City's review. The report will be finalized following review by City staff.

## CIWQS Electronic Data Management Tool (EDMT)

Electronic data reporting is required by the State and the WWTP NPDES permit. The City must upload its self-monitoring data monthly to the California Integrated Water Quality System (CIWQS). Under current operations, the City's monitoring data are maintained in Excel spreadsheets. Some data are uploaded directly to the CIWQS database while others are submitted via PDF attachments. Development of a Microsoft Access-based Electronic Data Management Tool (EDMT) will allow for ongoing compilation and management of the monitoring data in a single application and accommodate querying, analysis, and reporting of the data for internal and external use. Use of an EDMT by the City to submit all monitoring data to CIWQS will reduce staff time spent compiling and formatting data, eliminate monthly submittals of paper reports to the Regional Water Board, and reduce Annual Report contents.

LWA will assist the City in developing an EDMT and will provide training to City staff on how to property use the EDMT and upload data to CIWQS.

Staff has reviewed the proposal, determined that the services are necessary and reasonable, and recommends that Amendment No. 5 to the agreement with Larry Walker and Associates be approved. A copy of the proposal is attached to the proposed agreement. The total cost of these additional services is \$59,810 and cover the period of July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014. The total amount of the original contract, Amendment No. 1, Amendment No. 2, Amendment No. 3, Amendment No. 4, and Amendment No. 5 is \$196,868.

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## FISCAL IMPACT:

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The adopted Fiscal Year 13/14 Wastewater Enterprise Budget includes funding for these ongoing permit services.
