BACKGROUND / ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW: In August of 1996, the State Department of Health Services (now Dept. of Public Health) issued the City of Calistoga a Compliance Order related to the City's ability to provide an adequate and dependable water supply to its customers. The Compliance Order required the City to prepare a detailed evaluation of its water service abilities under maximum demand conditions, and to submit a plan and schedule for developing additional sources of supply and an adequate system for treatment and delivery of that supply.

One of the steps the City took in response to the Compliance Order was the preparation in 2000 of the Water Facilities Plan (WFP). The WFP addressed many of the Compliance Order issues and included a prioritized list of water system improvements necessary to meet operational and system storage requirements.

The City prepared an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration to assess five original project elements under CEQA in 2002. The City subsequently adopted a Mitigated Negative Declaration and filed a Notice of Determination in February 2002. Since the City had obtained grant and loan funding from the US Department of Agriculture (USDA) Consideration of a Resolution Approving the Plans and Specifications for the Kimball Water Treatment Plan Improvement Project, and Authorizing the Public Works Department to Advertise for Bids City Council Staff Report July 15, 2008

for these improvements, the City was also required to prepare a National Environmental Policy Act document to comply with regulations related to the use of federal funding. The five project components examined in the original environmental documents included: 1) replacement of an existing main connecting the Kimball Treatment Plant to a connecting main at the intersection of Tubbs Lane and Myrtledale Rd; 2) replacement of 5,200 feet of main in Myrtledale/Grant Street; 3) clarifier improvements at the Kimball Treatment Plan; 4) improvements to the Kimball Reservoir; and, 5) a treatment system for the Feige well.

The first phase of the overall project, consisting of the replacement of the Kimball and Myrtledale/Grant transmission pipelines (Components 1 and 2), was completed significantly under budget in December 2005. Components 3 and 4 have been fully designed, and Component 5 will not be pursued.

This second and final phase of the overall project includes work at the Kimball Water Treatment (primarily) and at the Kimball Reservoir. This project includes tube settlers in the clarifier, various process measurement and instrumentation improvements, a safety harness system for spillway access, and ancillary system improvements. As part of the ongoing design work, City staff and Erler & Kalinowski, the City's engineering consultant, identified certain additional deficiencies in some existing treatment systems. Staff recommended that certain systems be improved as part of the project, so as to take advantage of the ongoing design work and allow for the efficient construction of these improvements as part of the larger project (economy of scale).

The major additional project element that was not contained in the 2002 environmental review includes the construction of a third filter bank; a few minor additional elements, such as increasing the size of certain pumps or providing redundant pumps, is also now part of the project. {The improvements to the plant pumping systems are included as an alternate bid item in the plans; staff anticipates recommending award of this project element if the actual bid prices offered are favorable}. The new project elements represent relatively minor additions to the 2002 project description and provide redundancy and a more effective means to process drinking water.

Section 15163 of the CEQA Guidelines specifies that when only minor additions or changes to a project are necessary, a Supplement to a Negative Declaration is appropriate. As required by CEQA, the City prepared an Initial Study and Supplemental Mitigated Negative Declaration for a 30-day public review and comment period and conducted a Public Hearing on the matter. No substantive comments were received during this period, and the City filed a Notice of Determination for the Supplemental Mitigated Negative Declaration on May 8, 2008. All required environmental review for the project, at both the State and Federal levels, has been completed.

<u>DISCUSSION:</u> The design for this project has now been completed, and the required approval of the plans and specifications by both the USDA and the Dept. of Public Health

is pending. The public bidding process is proposed to occur from late July to late August, followed by a bid evaluation period, and we anticipate bringing the contract back to the Council for recommended award in September. The equipment procurement and construction phase is scheduled to occur in the October 2008 through March 2009 timeframe.

**FISCAL IMPACT**: The water facilities improvement project, including all components described in this report, is funded by a USDA funding package which includes a loan in the amount of \$2.51M and a grant in the amount of \$1.0M. Due to the first phase of the construction being completed under budget, there is substantial contingency funding available to fund the additional project elements. Most of the remaining funds available are *grant* funds, as the USDA requires the loan portion of the funding package to be fully utilized before grant funds are used. The utilization of USDA funds can only be finalized, however, based on the final project costs, which will be determined from the prices obtained during the bidding process and the actual change orders on the remaining portion of the overall project.

All project costs accrued to date for the first part of the project have been accepted by USDA, but some of the cost items were for project work that benefited both phases of the project. Staff does not anticipate any difficulty with resolving the final cost accounting with USDA following completion of the overall project.
