CITY COUNCIL - REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, JUNE 18, 2013 - 7:00 P.M.

A) CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Canning called the Regular Session to order at 7:01 p.m.

Chamber of Commerce, set the TOT incentive project. The bonus will not be implemented in the upcoming budget, according to **City Manger Spitler.**

7) Consideration of a Resolution approving Amendment No. 11 to the Water Supply Contract with the Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Agreement No. 1926 authorizing the sale of a portion of Calistoga's 2013 State Water Project Carryover Water Allocation via the Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.

Public Works Director Kirn presented the item. He stated that if the carryover is not sold in 2013, will remain in the City of Calistoga's bank but it will not be available for sale in the future. The proceeds from this water sale are not included in the 2013-2014 budget. An adjustment to the budget will be made when the revenues are received.

8) Consideration of a Resolution authorizing submittal of an application to the California State Department of Housing and Community Development for funding under the HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME); and if selected, the execution of a standard agreement.

Planning and Building Director Goldberg discussed this issue. City of Napa Housing Authority Specialist Andrea Clark with the First Time Home Buyer Program was available for questions. Ms. Clark suggested that the Resolution be amended to read 'City Manager' and not include a specific name. She mentioned that this grant is similar to the CDBG, but from a

different funding source. The City of Calistoga has a good chance of being awarded this grant, especially with a rural community status. This is a selfgenerating fund, with the payments coming back to the city for future appropriate loans.

Roxanne Bell, 1802 School Street inquired about the specific types of housing rehabilitation needed to receive this type of loan. Councilmember Barnes inquired the timeline before the funds are disbursed. Discussion ensued.

It was noted that if the number of incidents goes over 350 per year, any calls excess the contracted amount will be provided for free. Assistance By Hire Agreement and Strike Teams were discussed. Fire Chief Campbell thanked City Manager Spitler for having a huge impact for this contract by going directly to the County.

Mayor Canning reiterated the use of \$2 million from Silver Rose Impact Fees are addressed under Quality of Life, Public Safety and Waste Water in this budget.
