 2) To Receive Comment on Draft Water and Wastewater Rate Studies and adoption of a Resolution to set a public hearing for November 5, 2013 on possible rate increases.

City Manager Spitler explained that the public hearing is an opportunity for the City Council and the public to hear a presentation regarding the proposed rate increases. It was noted that any increase in water/wastewater rates is subject to Prop. 218 regulations. There will be a protest hearing on November 5, 2013, for public input. Mr. Spitler introduced Consultant David Spilman, to give a presentation regarding the results of the Draft 2013 Water and Wastewater Rate Studies. Mr. Spilman explained the findings from these studies. At the conclusion of Mr. Spilman's presentation, the public hearing was opened for public comment.

Public speaking to this item:

**Karen Chang, Myrtledale Avenue,** spoke of her concern that water and wastewater users outside city boundaries pay a surcharge for both. She requested that this surcharge be waived. **City Manger Spitler** stated that it costs more to deliver service those outside the city limits. Discussion ensued regarding the number of external water/wastewater users there are.

Joe Bob Hitchcock, 1322 Berry, requested that this issue be explained in simpler terms to make it clearer to the general public. Discussion on this issued ensued.

Charlotte Williams, 59 View Road, inquired about the contract between North Bay Aqueduct, Napa and Calistoga.

**Kristin Barberis, 3033 Myrtledale Road,** asked what the amount for the average single family residence cost reflects. Mr. Spilman explained Table 5 in the Draft Water Rate Study explains how the rates are generated.

**Dawnine Dyer, 1501 Diamond Mountain Road**, inquired about some of the details of the studies.

Joe Bob Hitchcock, 1322 Berry, discussed low income residents and the effect regarding the proposed rate. Mr. Spilman stated there is a separate price schedule for low income households, including the residents of the mobile home parks, which gives a 20% reduction in the water water rate. If the household qualifies for the Lifeline rate, it will qualify for the reduced rate.

**Christina Aranguren**, inquired if the NBA and Kimball Reservoir water are comingled and does the same water go to all water users. **Public Works Director Kirn** verified the same water is given to all of the users. He also explained that the water is drawn from both sources and can be purely from one source or a combination of the two.

192 193 **Bob Aranguren**, inquired as to why the water in his bathtub was brown a few weeks ago. He requested a goal of each person voluntarily using a reduction of 20 gallons per day per person, which will be about 10-11% reduction. This would be a short-term proclamation.
