CITY COUNCIL - REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, OCTOBER 15, 2013 - 7:00 P.M. CALISTOGA COMMUNITY CENTER 1307 WASHINGTON STREET, CALISTOGA CA 94515

A) CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Canning called the Regular Session to order at 7:01 p.m.

In attendance were the following: Councilmember Irais Lopez-Ortega, Councilmember James Barnes, Councilmember Gary Kraus, Vice Mayor Dunsford and Mayor Chris Canning.

C) ORAL COMMUNICATION ON CONSENT ITEMS OR NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Mike Costanzo, representing the Active Transportation Committee, announced the City of Calistoga was awarded the Silver Level Award by the League of American Bicycles as a bicycle-friendly community. This is the highest level in Napa County.

Joe Bob Hitchcock, read his letter regarding the decision of the Planning Commission and Calistoga City Council and his appeal to their decision.

Michael Quast, 1300 Washington Street, requested the Fairway extension be pulled from the Consent Calendar for discussion.

Councilmember Lopez-Ortega asked if anyone in the audience could translate for the large amount of Hispanic audience members.

Councilmember Kraus reminded the staff of a translating service used in the past when it was needed.

Mayor Canning announced the Community Forum at 6 pm on October 16, with the primary topic of Waste Water Management for the City of Calistoga. Representatives from the State of California Water Quality Control Board will be present. Water/Waste Water Rates will be discussed at the next City Council meeting on November 5, 2013.

1) Mayor Canning presented Administrative Services Director Leon an award from the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States for the fiscal year 2011-2012, for the comprehensive annual financial report. This is the first time the City of Calistoga has received this award. 7) Determination to reject the requested ordinance amendment, or direct staff to set a hearing date for consideration of the proposed amendment to the Downtown Commercial Zoning District to allow walk-up building facilities housing automated teller machines (ATMs).

Senior Planner Lundquist presented this item. Richard (No last name given), Consultant of Bank of America, explained the need for this ATM due to the large monthly ATM transactions at the branch. Clarence Luvisi, 285 Rosedale Road, suggested having the ATM inside the Bank.

Councilmember Kraus inquired about security for a walk-up ATM from Police Chief Celaya. Discussion ensued.
