4 BACKGROUND

- 5 State law requires the City to amend the safety element of its general plan to include
- analysis and policies regarding flood hazard and flood management information, prior to
- 7 the next revision of its housing element. Staff is currently drafting revisions to the
- 8 Housing Element that must be certified by the end of 2014.
- 9 The Public Safety Element was comprehensively updated as part of the 2003 Calistoga
- 10 General Plan. A number of revisions to the element are needed to reflect changes in
- circumstances. Since the Public Services Element includes a Fire Protection and
- 12 Emergency Medical Services section, this element also needs to be revised to maintain
- consistency within the General Plan.

- The primary revisions proposed to the Public Safety Element include the following (see Attachment 2 for all proposed changes):
 - Update the status of unreinforced masonry buildings
 - Incorporate the 2008 Flood Insurance Rate Map, which delineates the city's 100year floodplain (i.e., floodway and floodway fringe)
 - Provide background on wildfire prevention, response and recovery efforts
 - Update the inventory of hazardous waste sites
 - Acknowledge the permanent closure of the gliderport
 - · Update goals, objectives, policies and actions to reflect revisions to the above

25 Public Services Element

The primary revisions proposed to the Public Services Element include the following (see Attachment 3 for all proposed changes):

- Reflect the 2010/2011 upgrades to the fire station and current Fire Department equipment
 - Reflect completion of Mt. Washington water storage tank
 - Summarize the City's enhanced fire code requirements
 - Add a description of fire protection within the unincorporated area of the Planning Area
 - Add a description of emergency medical services
 - Update goals, objectives, policies and actions to reflect revisions to the above

- The proposed amendments to the Public Safety Element address all of the State's requirements related to flood hazards information, and goals, policies, objectives and implementation measures to address these hazards.
- 40 As required by state law, the City submitted the initial draft of the revised Public Safety
- Element to the State Board of Forestry and Fire Protection for review. Staff responded
- to the Board's comments on the initial draft and submitted a revised draft for review. On
- November 25, 2013, the City was advised that the Board has no further comments.

44 ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

- 45 Under Section 15061(b)(3) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)
- Guidelines, the proposed amendments are not subject to CEQA because it can be seen
- with certainty that there is no possibility that they could have a significant effect on the
- 48 environment.

49 RECOMMENDATION

- 50 Staff recommends that the Planning Commission adopt a resolution recommending to
- the City Council approval of amendments to the Public Safety and Public Services
- 52 Elements of the Calistoga General Plan in order to update them and bring the General
- 53 Plan into conformance with state law.
