# E) COUNCIL REQUESTS AND IDEAS FOR DISCUSSION

**Councilmember Lopez-Ortega** reminded everyone that June is Alzheimer's Awareness Month. She urged people to learn more about the disease and how to can help those afflicted.

**Councilmember Barnes** suggested that street cleaning days be scheduled so they aren't on the same days as garbage pick-up.

**Councilmember Kraus** discussed code issues associated with the fire that occurred last week at the end of Washington Street. He requested amending the Calistoga Municipal Code to reflect Unlawful Continuance of a Fire Hazard as a misdemeanor. It was deleted with the last Code update.

Mayor Canning attended the grand re-opening of the Teen Center. It was well-attended, including many youth. He thanked the City staff for their work in getting the teen center re-opened. He reminded everyone to be sure to vote since it is Election Day. He also reminded everyone of the June 18<sup>th</sup> Community Forum. He attended 2 Memorial Day events - one at Pioneer Cemetery and one at the Logvy Veteran's Memorial. He also requested that staff address any issues that need to be cleared up from the lower Washington Street/Camp Drive fire last week.

#### F) PROCLAMATIONS/ PRESENTATIONS/ AWARDS

- 1) **Mayor Canning** read the Proclamation declaring the Month of June as Land Trust of Napa County Month.
- 2) Fire Chief Campbell gave a Report of Status of Fire Danger for the Upcoming Fire Season. He noted the North-facing slopes, which are historically the last to dry out, are already becoming dry. He requested citizens remove combustible debris from their property. The south-side Foothill Blvd. Corridor is of most concern. Council discussion ensued.

9) Amending the Municipal Code Prohibiting the Distribution of Single-Use Carryout Bags by Designated Businesses. (MCA 2014-3)

Planning and Building Director Goldberg presented the item. Council discussion ensued. Mayor Canning clarified the charges for the bag does not go to the City of Calistoga, but stays with the merchant who is collecting them. The bag charge is to incentivize a change or modification of public behavior.

Mayor Canning opened Public Comment.

**Green Committee Chairman Karen Chang** stated the wording and creation of this proposed regulation was modeled after other city's regulations.

**Green Committee Member Carl Sherrill** reiterated the notion of charging for bags to cause people to bring their own bags. He also mentioned this will help reduce litter.

Mayor Canning closed Public Comment.

There was Consensus of the Council to Direct Staff to Amend the Calistoga Municipal Code to Prohibit the Distribution of Single-Use Carryout Bags by Designated Businesses (MCA 2014-3).
