ISSUE:

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Consideration of a resolution authorizing the use of Lincoln Avenue from Cedar Street to the ACE Hardware parking lot entrance for the Calistoga Chamber of Commerce Harvest Table Event on September 7, 2014.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1) Consider the adoption of the Resolution and 2) provide direction to staff on Special Event Conditions of Approval.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

The Calistoga Chamber of Commerce has applied for a Special Event Permit for Harvest Table. The event is planned for September 7, 2014 from 5:00 to 9:00 PM and will include various live music venues and one long banquet table placed on Lincoln Avenue. There will be one dinner service at 6:00 pm and participating restaurants will simultaneously serve guests. Approximately 600 guests are expected and approximately 15 restaurants are expected to participate in the event. (See Exhibit B for proposed Table layout).

The event planners are requesting the closure of Lincoln Avenue from Cedar Street to the ACE Hardware parking lot entrance from 1:00-11:00 PM, with its intersection with Washington closed from 4:30-10:00 PM. Any event which requires closure of a Calistoga city street requires City Council approval. Furthermore, each applicant must provide required insurance and comply with any terms or conditions applied to the permit.

Consideration of Street Closure for Calistoga Chamber of Commerce Harvest Table Event July 15, 2014

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Lincoln Avenue is State right-of-way (Hwy. 29) and an encroachment permit is required from Caltrans for special events thereon. The Chamber of Commerce will apply directly to the State for the encroachment permit for this event. The City of Calistoga Special Event Permit will include this condition of approval.

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As proposed, Lincoln Ave. would be closed between Cedar Street and the ACE Hardware parking lot entrance, including the intersection with Washington Avenue. All on-street parking would be eliminated during the street closure. The public parking lots next to the Police Department and behind the Fire Department would remain open.

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Staff has identified some initial concerns that will need to be addressed as part of the Special Events Permit, which is subject to approval by the City Manager:

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 Attendee safety: Large trucks or other movable barricades should be placed at all ends of the event (four locations in total) to prevent wayward drivers from entering the dining area. The Chamber should coordinate with the Police Department for appropriate levels of public safety officers and/or private security. Given the number of attendees anticipated, the Chamber should coordinate with AMR to have emergency medical service on standby during the event

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 Private Parking Lots/Alleys: There are several private access points onto Lincoln within the proposed event area (see Exhibit B) which raise a safety concern. These include access to parking lots for West America Bank, Bank of America and Mountain View Hotel and Spa. There is also a private alley between Calistoga Village Bakery and Blackbirds. These access points should be secured to prevent unauthorized entry into the event area.

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 Table location: Placement of tables down the middle of Lincoln Avenue will impact emergency vehicle access. The tables should be off-set from the center line to provide the greatest EVA width possible.

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63 64 Traffic Circulation: The closure of Lincoln at its intersection with Washington
will disrupt traffic circulation. The intersection should remain open to traffic
during the event and that the traffic signal be used for traffic control as well as
advance sign placement. This will minimize the traffic detour through the ACE
Hardware parking lot.

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 Public Transit: The Napa Vine public transit operates two bus stops within the proposed event area. The Chamber should coordinate with NCTPA Transit to

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identify alternate bus stops and appropriate detour routes to minimize impacts to transit users.

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 Parking: Assuming that 500 of the attendees will drive to the event, between 200-250 cars are anticipated. The elimination of on-street parking on Lincoln results in a net loss of 80 regular and 3 disabled parking spaces. Parking arrangements should be made at the Fairgrounds and a shuttle service established.

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 Bicycle Traffic: Under the California Vehicle Code bicycles are considered a vehicle. Closure of Lincoln Ave. to all traffic technically includes bicycles. Bicycles should be allowed to ride through the closure until 5:00 PM. After 5:00 PM bicyclists should be required to walk their bicycles through the event area or follow the identified detours.

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• **Alcohol consumption:** Any alcohol consumption will need to be conducted in accordance with ABC requirements.

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If Council supports the event and requested road closure, staff recommends adoption of the attached resolution. Staff also seeks Council direction regarding inclusion of staff recommendations into the Special Event Permit for the items noted above.

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CONSISTENCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES:

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Approving the requested street closure would be consistent with Goal 1: Objective 2: Promote the qualities of Calistoga that are attractive to residents and visitors.

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FISCAL IMPACT:

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The use of public streets for special events has no significant fiscal impact on the City. The Chamber of Commerce will be responsible for all costs, including staff time, incurred with the street closure. The proposed event has the potential to increase sales tax and TOT revenues to the City's General Fund.
