On December 8, 1999, Phase II rules were published in the Federal Register requiring Napa County and the City of Napa to obtain an NPDES permit for stormwater discharges by March 10, 2003. Subsequently, the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) added Yountville, St. Helena and Calistoga to the list of Phase II agencies required to obtain the permit. The City of American Canyon was not initially included in the Phase II regulations because they were issued a Phase I permit in 2000, but the City was granted Phase II status by the RWQCB in 2005.

As required by the Phase II General Permit, a Stormwater Management Program (SWMP) was developed and submitted to the RWQCB by March 10, 2003. The SWMP consists of Local Programs implemented by the County and Cities and a County-wide Program implemented by

the Flood Control District for the benefit of the NCSWMP co-permittees. The Flood Control District provides \$30,000 from the Maintenance and Watershed Programs Project No. 96-1 fund to cover part of the County-wide Program costs. The remainder of the County-wide program costs are paid for by the NCSWMP co-permittees according to a cost-share formula based on 50% population size and 50% Benefit Assessment Units.

The Phase II General Permit and the current SWMP expired during the 2007/2008 fiscal year. The State Water Resource Control Board is currently drafting a new General Permit which is expected to be issued in the spring of 2009. At this time a new SWMP will need to be submitted to the Regional Water Quality Control Board for approval. On March 20, 2008 the Public works Directors from the cities and the County met with Flood Control District staff to discuss the need to develop a new SWMP and the areas where the SWMP needs to be strengthened. In particular, the RWQCB has commented that public education and outreach efforts should be increased.

Based on this discussion, the County, cities, and the Flood Control District agreed that staffing for the County-wide Program should be increased from 0.6FTE to 1.0FTE. Amendment No. 4 will increase the total budget for the County-wide Program from \$128,4000 to \$148,400 and the City of Calistoga's proportional cost reimbursement obligation will increase from \$3,420 to \$4,133.

The attached Amendment No. 4 to the agreement would increase the co-permittees' proportional cost obligations to coordinate the development of a new Stormwater Management Program and to increase county-wide educational efforts. All other conditions of that agreement would remain in effect. The attached resolution would approve the amendment and authorize the City Mayor to execute it.

GENERAL PLAN CONFORMANCE:

This project is in compliance with the City's General Plan Objective I-4.3 – Encourage coordination between land use planning, site design and storm water control.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approval of the agreement amendment would increase the City's proportional share by \$712.40.

AGREEMENT TO FUND AND ADMINISTER THE NAPA COUNTY STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM AMENDMENT NO. 4

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 4 TO THE AGREEMENT TO FUND AND ADMINISTER THE NAPA COUNTY STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM ("Agreement"), is made and entered into as of this _____ day of _____, 2008 by and between the Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, a special district of the State of California, ("DISTRICT"), the City of Napa, the City of St. Helena, the City of Calistoga, the Town of Yountville and the City of American Canyon, (collectively, "CITIES"), and the County of Napa, a political subdivision of the State of California, ("COUNTY"). DISTRICT, CITIES and COUNTY are also referred to herein as "party" individually and "parties" collectively.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the parties entered into the Agreement on July 1, 2003 and subsequently amended it on June 15, 2004, November 15, 2005, and July 24, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the Phase II Municipal Stormwater NPDES General Permit (CAS000004) expired on April 30, 2008 and a new General Permit is expected to be issued in the Spring of 2009; and

WHEREAS, the Stormwater Management Program (SWMP) developed and implemented by the Cities and County ended on June 30, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the parties now wish to increase the Cities' and County's Proportional Cost Reimbursement Obligations in order to fund additional staff time to coordinate the development of a new SWMP and to increase county-wide education efforts.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties amend the Agreement in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein:

TERMS

1. The Cities' and County's Proportional Costs Reimbursement Obligations in Section 3 of the Agreement shall be set forth in Exhibit B1, B2, B3, B4 attached hereto and hereby incorporated by reference herein. All references to Exhibit B in Section 3 of the Agreement shall mean that Exhibit B (B1, B2, B3, B4) which corresponds to the period noted below.

2. All other terms and provision of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
