# **BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION:**

On June 13, 2014 the following claimants filed claims against the City of Calistoga related to alleged damage to the mobile home located at 11 Camellia Drive, Calistoga from construction activities associated with the Indian Springs resort expansion (see Attachment 2).

20 They are represented by attorney Victor Peter Obninsky. They each claim damages in excess of \$10,000. The claims state that the City of Calistoga has responsibility because the damage is a public nuisance and the City issued a use permit to allow the construction.

As stated in the claims the alleged damage to the mobile home occurred as a result of the Indian Spring resort expansion. Whenever the City staff received a complaint about this development project, the manager of the project was contacted to address the situation. The alleged damage was not caused by the City as we have no participation in the actual construction of the project. This is a matter between two private parties and not the City. Further, the City has no knowledge of the status of the subject mobile home either before or during construction so we do not know if damages actually occurred. The inside of mobile homes are regulated and inspected by HCD and not the city of Calistoga. We do not have the expertise or authority to assess this mobile home. In addition the development agreement with the owners of Indian Springs Resort provides that the resort owners have assumed all risks of claims arising out of the agreement and is required to indemnify, protect, defend and hold harmless the City in the above-referenced action.

On July 18, 2014 the City was served with a lawsuit from these same individuals in Superior Court regarding the same issue related to a public nuisance assertion and seeking damages in excess of \$40,000. This matter has been referred to the City Attorney and our insurance provider.
