Describe your program:

Active Games Lab:

Childhood obesity is a critical issue in our community and considering the state of health in America it isn't surprising. We've all been in the same boat, you go for a run or lift weights and find that although you feel as though you've been working out for a long time it's only been a few minutes; working out feels like work. The Boys & Girls Club specializes in disguised learning and activity and firmly believes that greatest lessons are learned through fun and engaging activities. According to the Entertainment Software Rating Board the average child spends roughly 8 hours a week playing video games. So we found ourselves wondering what if we could find a way to alter that gaming experience from sitting on a couch alone to an Xbox Kinect Based approach with Jumping, lunging, and running among peers.

"The results suggest that using active gaming in a weight treatment program may be an effective strategy to promote physical activity and healthy weight among overweight and obese youth." – Dr. <u>Deneen Vojta</u>, a UnitedHealth Group executive physician

We purchased one xbox in 2013 and the results were impressive. Member were very excited to participate and found that the activity was enjoyed because it was play based and communicated to them in a familiar and fun way.

"I used to think exercise was boring, but when I play games with the Xbox, I don't think of it as exercise and I still get the benefits to my health. The Xbox Kinect helped me be more active, particularly during the winter when it can be harder to be outside. This program really worked for me."

Now it's time to expand this program and we're turning to the Calistoga Community. We would like to purchase and install a Kinect lab at Calistoga Elementary School so that more of our members can utilize this technology and reap the rewards of consistent and intensive physical activity. A separate space would be created where members could participate in dance, sports, and adventure based games; all of which aim to give kids what they need by way of what they want.

How will this program benefit the Calistoga Community? How will the program address the following City Council's adopted Enrichment Objectives?

Objective 2: provide services to youth in the community.

Utilization of this program will be open to the youth of Calistoga as a whole regardless of whether they are Boys & Girls Clubs of St. Helena and Calistoga members. Priority will be given to youth who are currently enrolled in an afterschool program such as ASES, 21ST Century Learning Center, and/or the Boys & Girls Club Teen Center.

1. Objective 3: Expand services to members of the Hispanic community.

As stated above, the Boys & Girls Clubs of St. Helena and Calistoga programs are open to all school-age youth. Hispanic youth constitute a vast majority of the school district's ethnic population. The demographic information we've been provided with indicates that the Hispanic population at Calistoga Elementary School accounts for 76% of its student body. The Hispanic population at Calistoga Junior/Senior High accounts for 73% of its student body. As such these programs would directly impact and expand on services to members of the Hispanic community.

How this helps the Calistoga Community:

School and after-school programs are struggling to provide our community's youth with the requisite resources to be positive and productive citizens. Funding programs like the Club's proposed Kinect Lab program is a solid investment because they encourage and support independent academic and physical development while making the experience entertaining and fun. This "disguised learning" technique would be particularly effective in Calistoga as so many of our youth come from disadvantaged circumstances and would not, otherwise, have access to these resources.

The dynamic nature of this investment is such that the units themselves are so versatile and can be reapplied at the program's completion with very little waste. At the end of the grant period these consoles could be utilized in a number of alternate programs from literacy, to science, to mathematics. As such an investment in this program would constitute a lasting investment in the youth of Calistoga and its greater community.

The City is resolved to: "support activities which enrich the Calistoga community" and we believe that the programs we propose in addition to the long-term benefit of these units as they are utilized throughout their life constitute a solid, if not the best, investment in that resolution. The Boys & Girls Club, which serves a substantial portion of Calistoga's youth year round, is uniquely positioned to meet the goals of the City Council's Community Enrichment Grant objectives and to provide

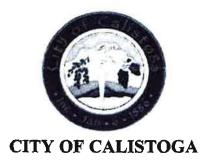

The Calistoga Art Center continually strives to maximize benefits to the diverse Calistoga community, both in age and in ethnicity.

*Building on the success of its 2013-14 Art Markets, the Market will move to the Police Department parking lot for at least two sessions, for greater drop-in traffic, locals and visitors—more visibility; more sales; more income for the artists.

*Both the 2013 theater offerings and the on-going Art Markets have stimulated interest from an older population. Word of mouth has made these a comfortable social occasion, as well as a shopping opportunity for unique art (painting, jewelry, ceramics and more) and a chance to spend time with the artists. The artists often meet for the first time, and learn from each other.

*CAC continues to:

Administer the Elementary School Art Docent program;
Offer PaintOut!, publicized throughout the Bay Area art community;
Partner with the Napa County Fair, offering popular, free art projects for families;
Be the only Calistoga facility dedicated to the arts and culture;
Work with the School District for art classes, both in school and at the Center;
Have a strong ELD program, with class time, museum trips and art shows;
Create new partnerships: Calistoga Joy Ride, Nimbus Art Center.

*In addition, CAC sponsored a low-cost Musicale for Valentine's Day, 2014, with more to come; in future, it is hoped we can pay musicians, but for now, it's all volunteer and in the spirit of community.

Many of the CAC-initiated projects bring in a modest financial return to the Center, in keeping with our stated purpose to support artists and use art as education for the community and to make the community more cohesive. We rely on grants, donors, fundraisers and volunteer hours to meet these challenges.

CalistogaCares is an all-volunteer program that provides supplemental n food to low income families and seniors. We are the recipient of the food collected by the Mail carriers drive. Food is also obtained from individual donations and outdated products from CalMart and San Marcos. We receive some free food from the Napa Food Bank and also purchase food through them. Those meeting income requirements receive a bag of food once a month including fresh produce, eggs and milk. Amount How Will this program benefit the Calistoga Community? Staples such as peanut butter, rice, beans, canned goods and cereal are purchased from the Food Bank at cost. Food left over from the USDA distribution is given out through this program.

Describe your program:

Challenging Latinos to Access Resources and Opportunities, known as CLARO, and Challenging Latinas through Awareness, Resources and Action, known as CLARA, are youth mentoring programs provided by the UpValley Family Centers to help young Latinas and Latinos build positive identities in a process of self-exploration through the lens of culture. We offer culturally-based youth development activities through weekly group sessions led by positive role models. Sessions are focused on developing skills related to decision-making, conflict resolution, communication, self-reflection and increasing awareness of one's cultural identity. These prevention-oriented groups foster positive connections among peers, build students' engagement in school, strengthen self-identity, and develop leadership skills. In addition to weekly groups, we strive to organize field trips and college visits for our participants as funding permits. The program is offered at Calistoga Junior Senior High School, and reaches approximately 60 Calistoga students each year.

How will this program benefit the Calistoga Community? How will the program address the following City Council's adopted Enrichment Objectives "Will the activity or program...":

- 1. Provide services to the elder community.
- 2. Provide services to youth in the community.
- 3. Expand services to members of the Hispanic community.

CLARO and CLARA benefits Hispanic youth in the Calistoga community (items 3 and 4 above).

Although Latinos and Latinas are our focus, we offer these programs to any students who are interested to increase cultural awareness and create an appreciation for cultural diversity and inclusion. Program evaluation results have demonstrated that the program had a positive impact on students' perceptions of their ethnic identity. 99% of respondents reported agreement to the item, "I have a lot of pride in my ethnic group," an increase of 10% at the post-survey. The large majority of participants also reported positive perceptions about the program and group facilitator. This program benefits the Calistoga Community by providing middle and high school aged Hispanic and other youth with inspiring group experiences where they can: 1) explore their cultural identity in a safe environment, 2) form positive friendships, 3) express themselves, ask questions and learn about a variety of topics facing youth, and 4) build confidence as young people who are increasingly making their own decisions.

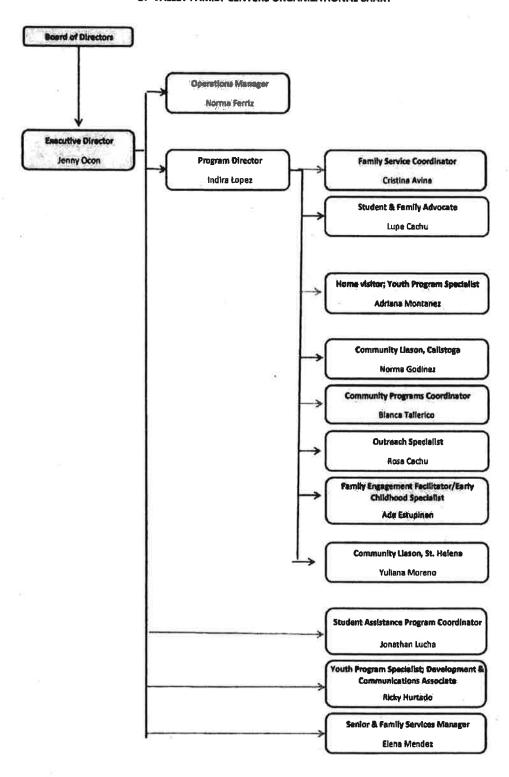
