Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network WARN 2007 Omnibus Mutual Assistance Agreement for Water and Wastewater

Utilities Emergencies

ISSUE: Consideration of a Resolution approving the California Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network WARN 2007 Omnibus Mutual Assistance Agreement (CalWARN) for water and wastewater utilities emergencies.

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RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the Resolution.

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Although the City of Calistoga participates in the County-wide Mutual Aid Agreement, the CalWARN agreement would allow participation with other cities outside Napa County.

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As members of the CalWARN agreement, the City may request mutual aid and assistance from a participating member. Members are not obligated to respond to a request for aid, however, they are required to notify the requesting member as to whether they will respond with aid. If the City should respond with aid to another entity, that aid may be withdrawn at any time for any reason.

Membership in the agreement requires giving emergency contact information and information related to the types of equipment that could be available.

Costs related to mutual aid assistance are reimbursable from the entity requesting the personnel and/or equipment services. Accurate and complete records must be kept by the responding member and the requesting member will have access to review the responding members' records prior to payment of any invoices.

Given the significant amount of water and wastewater infrastructure damage sustained from the recent 6.0 earthquake in Napa, staff recommends that the City of Calistoga enroll in the California Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network WARN 2007 Omnibus Mutual Assistance Agreement.

CONSISTENCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES: This project is consistent with Goal No. 3, Establish, improve and maintain City infrastructure; and Objective No. 1, maintain the high level of service and reliability of the City's infrastructure systems and facilities.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact related to enrolling in the CalWARN program. Any costs incurred as a result of a mutual aid request will be reimbursed by the requesting entity. If Calistoga requests mutual aid we will be responsible for reimbursing the assisting entity.

RESOLUTION NO. 2014 - XXX 1 2 3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALISTOGA, COUNTY 4 OF NAPA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE 5 CALIFORNIA WATER/WASTEWATER AGENCY RESPONSE NETWORK WARN 2007 OMNIBUS MUTUAL ASSISTANCE AGREEMENT 6 7 8 AGREEMENT NO. 9 10 WHEREAS, recognizing that emergencies may require assistance in the form of personnel, 11 equipment, and supplies from outside the area of impact, an intrastate program for mutual aid and 12 assistance has been established (CalWARN); and 13 14 WHEREAS, through this mutual aid and assistance program, members coordinate response 15 activities and share resources during emergencies on an as requested basis, but are not obligated to 16 provide resources; and 17 18 WHEREAS, participation in the CalWARN agreement would allow the City to receive and give 19 assistance to cities outside of the Napa County; and 20 21 WHEREAS, costs related to mutual aid assistance are reimbursable from the entity requesting 22 the aid; and 23 24 WHEREAS, considering the number of broken water mains, etc. as a result of the 6.0 earthquake 25 in Napa on August 24, 2014, staff recommends participation in the California Water/Wastewater Agency 26 Response Network WARN 2007 Omnibus Mutual Assistance Agreement (attached). 27 28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the City Council hereby finds: 29 30 1. Mutual aid assistance with cities outside the Napa County region would be a benefit to the City of 31 Calistoga in the event of an emergency similar to the 6.0 earthquake in the City of Napa on 32 August 24, 2014. 33 2.
