E) COUNCIL REQUESTS AND IDEAS FOR DISCUSSION

Councilmember Lopez-Ortega reported on the events of the League of Cities Conference she attended on August 6-8, 2014, in Los Angeles. She encouraged the community to get more involved and develop community projects.

She also reiterated the process of distributing the Community Enrichment Grant money and the fiduciary responsibility of the Community Enrichment Grant Committee.

Councilmember Kraus inquired about the code enforcement issues regarding the property at the south end of Washington Street connected with the fire that recently occurred. City Manger Spitler reported the property owner has complied with all of the code infractions within the property to the satisfaction of the Fire Chief and Building Official. However, there are two vehicles located just outside the property that need to be abated. Councilmember Kraus asked if the County Health Department had inspected the property for contaminated soils. Mr. Spitler said the would look into this matter.

Mayor Canning reported the Community Forum will be September 17 at 6 P.M. at the Community Center. There is no topic for this session.

He also thanked the City of Calistoga for the work involved in making the September 7th Harvest Table event successful. A total of 640 people were served, 13 restaurants and 45 wineries were involved.

 Mayor Canning announced on September 20, the Coastal and River Clean Up day will be held in Calistoga. Check in at 9 A.M. at the Calistoga Community Center, where everyone will be assigned an area of clean up. He also announced on September 23, at the Community Center, the Red Cross Community Disaster Education Program from 3 – 4:30 P.M. There is also a Spanish version of this program on September 30th from 6-7:30 P.M. at the Community Center.

Mayor Canning announced on September 20th is the completion of the Ragnar relay race completion for the 5th year in a row. The end of the relay is at the Napa Fairgrounds. It is a 198 mile race from San Francisco, bringing 6,300 racers to Calistoga.
