CITY OF CALISTOGA PLANNING COMMISSION RESOLUTION NO. 2014-__

ADOPTING A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION FOR THE IMPER PROJECT AT 1998 CEDAR STREET

WHEREAS, the applicants have submitted a design review application (DR 2012-3) for modifications to an existing residence and accessory buildings located at 1998 Cedar Street (APN 011-410-015); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration was prepared that identified potentially-significant impacts to the environment in the areas of biological resources, cultural resources, geology/soils and hydrology/water quality; and

WHEREAS, the applicants have agreed to amend the proposed project to incorporate mitigation measures that would reduce the potential impacts to a less than significant level; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission reviewed the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration during a public hearing on November 12, 2014, and during its review, considered the public record, including the staff report, findings, and written materials and public testimony; and

WHEREAS, that on the basis of the Initial Study prepared for the project the Planning Commission has determined that with the incorporation of mitigation measures the Imper Project will not have a significant effect on the environment and, therefore, a Mitigated Negative Declaration should be adopted based on the finding that the project will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, based on the above findings, the Planning Commission hereby adopts the Imper Project Mitigated Negative Declaration, subject to the following Mitigation Measures and Monitoring Program:

Biological Resources

Mitigation Measure BIO-1: Department of Fish and Wildlife Permits

Any permits required by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife shall be obtained prior to any disturbance below the top of the creek bank, including the installation of landscaping or retaining structures.

Mitigation Measure BIO-2: Tree Protection Plan

Prior to issuance of a building permit for the project, a Tree Protection and Replacement Plan consistent with Calistoga Municipal Code Chapter 19.01 shall be reviewed and approved by the Public Works Department. All requirements and restrictions contained in Chapter 19.01 shall be complied with, including the

incorporation of replacement trees for those trees slated for removal, if appropriate, as well as any recommendations of the project arborist.

<u>Cultural Resources</u>

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Mitigation Measure CR-1: Barn Renovation

Chemical and physical treatments shall be undertaken using the gentlest means possible. Treatments that cause damage to historic materials shall not be used. New materials on the barn shall be consistent with the historic materials for the barn. Salvage materials shall be used to the maximum extent feasible.

Mitigation Measure CR-2: Construction Monitoring

- Construction personnel shall be informed that collecting archaeological, historical and paleontological materials discovered during construction is prohibited by law.
- 2. During ground-disturbing activities, a qualified Native American monitor and tribal member shall be present to monitor the site and activities.

Mitigation Measure CR-3: Treatment of Discovered Resources

- 1. If archaeological, historical or paleontological resources are encountered during construction, all activity in the immediate vicinity shall cease.
- The find shall be inspected by a qualified archaeologist. If the archaeologist determines that the find is potentially significant (e.g., meets the definition of historic resource or unique archaeological resource), the archaeologist shall record the find and implement appropriate treatment of it.

Mitigation Measure CR-4: Treatment of Human Remains, Associated Grave Goods, and Items of Cultural Patrimony

- If human remains are encountered during construction activities, there shall be no further excavation or disturbance of the remains or nearby area until the Napa County Coroner has made the necessary findings as to origin.
- If the Coroner believes the human remains to be those of a Native American, he or she shall contact, by telephone within 24 hours, the Native American Heritage Commission.
- Upon notification, the Commission shall immediately notify the most likely descendent (MLD). The remains shall not be damaged or disturbed by further development until the City has discussed and conferred with the MLD regarding their recommendations.
- 4. The descendent shall inspect the site of the discovery and may recommend the means for treating or disposing, with appropriate dignity, the human remains and any associated grave goods. The descendants shall complete their inspection and make their recommendation within 48 hours of their notification by the Commission.

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71 Geology and Soils

Mitigation Measure GEO-1: Design Level Geotechnical Report and Implementation

Prior to the issuance of a grading or building permit for any portion of the project site, a final design-level geotechnical report prepared by a qualified geotechnical engineer, and that reflects the recommendations contained in the project's geotechnical investigation, shall be submitted to the Planning and Building Department for review and approval. Any recommendations contained in the report shall be implemented.

Mitigation Measure GEO-2: Geotechnical Monitoring

A qualified geotechnical engineer shall provide intermittent geotechnical engineering observations, along with necessary field and laboratory testing, during 1) the beginning of grading and foundation excavation operations, 2) removal of weak soils, 3) fill placement and compaction, 4) preparation and compaction of subgrade and 5) completed footing excavations. Upon completion of the project, a final inspection shall be performed by the engineer prior to occupancy.

Hydrology and Water Quality

Mitigation Measure HYD-1: Stormwater Drainage Plan

Prior to issuance of a grading or building permit, the permit holder shall submit a stormwater drainage plan for approval by the Planning and Building Department in conformity with the National Pollution Discharge Elimination System and including Best Management Practices (BMP) as described in the California Stormwater BMP Handbook or equivalent.
