1 REQUEST

2 Consider adopting a Mitigated Negative Declaration of Environmental Impact for the

3 Fair Way Extension Path Project

4 BACKGROUND

- 5 A ten-foot wide Class 1 path for use by bicyclists and pedestrians currently extends
- 6 westerly from Dunaweal Lane to the Little League fields, terminating approximately 0.6
- 7 miles from central Calistoga. The Calistoga Active Transportation Plan calls for this path
- to extend to the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and Fair Way Extension.
- 9 On June 17, 2014, the City Council selected a preferred alignment for the path
- extension and directed staff to proceed with the preparation of construction plans and
- 11 environmental analysis.

12 ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

- An Initial Study prepared for the project identified potential environmental impacts in the
- areas of air quality, biological resources, hydrology/water quality, noise,
- transportation/traffic and utilities. However, it was determined that although the
- proposed project could have a significant effect on the environment, there will not be a
- significant effect in this case because project revisions have been agreed to by the City.
- Therefore, a Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) was prepared. Please refer to the
- MND for more details on potential impacts and the project's mitigation monitoring
- 20 program.

21 PUBLIC COMMENTS

- The MND was sent to the State for distribution to appropriate agencies, and owners and
- occupants of property contiguous to the project within 300 feet were notified of its
- 24 availability for review. No comments had been received by the close of the 30-day
- public review period (November 20).
