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ISSUE: Consideration of a Resolution approving Amendment No. 2 to the Professional Services Agreement with David K. Tompkins ("Consultant") for ongoing permit assistance services related to the City's wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) in the amount of \$20,000 and approving a budget amendment in the amount of \$20,000.

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RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the resolution.

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14 15 <u>BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION</u>: The City of Calistoga Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) was issued a revised NPDES Permit in November, 2010, by the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB). Under this permit, the City may discharge treated effluent to the Napa River during the wet season (October 1st through May 15th) as long as dilution ratios are met. During the remainder of the year, river discharge is prohibited and all effluent produced at the WWTP must be stored or recycled.

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21 22 The monitoring and reporting requirements associated with the City's NPDES permit continue to become more complex, and the RWQCB has imposed mandatory fines for certain permit violations. David Tompkins is the former Utilities Director for the City of Vacaville and has extensive experience in dealing with violation issues and their resolution with the Regional Board. Recently the Regional Board issued a

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cease and desist order for antimony and directed the City to prepare an engineering report for monitoring of boron in the wastewater.

The City previously entered into a professional services agreement with David Tompkins for support services and the agreement was executed by the City Manager in accordance with City policy and practice. Given the new level of effort required to comply with the cease and desist order it is necessary to extend and increase the authorized amount of this agreement.

Mr. Tompkins will assist the City in developing the monitoring program and coordinating field activities with Larry Walker and Associates to address various discharge limitations and reporting requirements under the cease and desist order. The recommended resolution extends the agreement through December 31, 2015, increases the authorized amount of expenditures by \$20,000 for a total amount of \$50,000, and approves a budget adjustment to cover the additional expenditures.

CONSISTENCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES: This agreement is consistent with City Council Goal No. 3 – Establish, improve and maintain City infrastructure; and the City Council Objective (Maintain the high level of service and reliability of the City's infrastructure systems and facilities).

FISCAL IMPACT: The recommended resolution approves a budget adjustment in the amount of \$20,000 under account number 03-4142-4402 from the unappropriated Wastewater Enterprise fund balance for the additional services.

Authorizing Agreement No. 522-2

WHEREAS, City and David K. Tompkins (Consultant) have previously entered into an Agreement (Agreement No. 522) to provide technical and professional assistance services in connection with water and wastewater plant operations of the Public Works Department and state regulatory agencies; and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2013 the City and Consultant approved Amendment No. 1 to Agreement No. 522 for additional professional services associated with the City's utility systems; and

WHEREAS, in November, 2014 the Regional Water Quality Control Board issued a Cease and Desist Order and directed the City to conduct monitoring of boron and antimony and other constituents of concern derived from geothermal water discharges into the City's sewer collection system; and

WHEREAS, the City and Consultant desire to amend Agreement No. 522 for additional services related to the Cease and Desist Order.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Calistoga approves:

1. The expenditure of \$20,000 for additional services for development of monitoring plans, engineering reports and other related activities for compliance with the Cease and Desist Order.

2. A Budget Adjustment in the amount of \$20,000 increasing appropriations for Wastewater Treatment - Contract Services (Account 03-4142-4402) under account number 03-4142-4402 from the unappropriated wastewater enterprise fund balances.

3. The Second Amendment to Contract 522 with David K. Tompkins for additional services for development of monitoring plans, engineering reports and other related activities for compliance with the Cease and Desist Order in an amount not to exceed \$20,000, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$50,000.
