ISSUE: Accept update from staff on the Monhoff Recreation Center and provide direction regarding use of Racquet Ball Court #1.

BACKGROUND: The Monhoff Recreation Center was damaged last year due to a leaky roof. On March 17, 2015 the City Council approved a professional services agreement (PSA) with Thomas Stimpert, Architect in an amount not to exceed \$64,000 for preparation of plans and construction documents for rehabilitation of the Monhoff Recreation Center. During the discussion at the time of award of the PSA the City Council requested that we reach out to the stakeholders as part of the rehabilitation plan preparation process – with special attention to the Teen Center and racquet ball players.

Mr. Stimpert has developed "as built" plans of the building, reviewed the building with a structural engineer and received guidance on improving the buildings resistance to seismic events, developed a preliminary fire suppression plan and is working with a sprinkler company for final design, and is moving forward with the overall plans including addressing ADA issues. The goal is to bid the project in late July or early August.

In March we held two meetings with the stakeholders. The first meeting was with representatives from the Teen Center and the second meeting with a joint meeting with representatives from the Teen Center and the racquet ball players.

The Teen Center group stated that the current temporary modular is significantly better than the space in the lower part of the Monhoff building, and for them to go back into the Monhoff Update City Council Staff Report May 5, 2015 Page 2 of 2

smaller area would be difficult without additional area. They requested that Racquet Ball Court #1 (the one closest to the tennis court) be dedicated exclusively to them and a door way be installed between the Teen Center and Racquet Ball Court #1. The Teen Center group indicated Racquet Ball Court #1 would be used to house their pool table, ping pong table and would provide a better opportunity to increase teen participation in their programs.

The racquet ball players indicated that the Monhoff Center was constructed by volunteers, many of them racquet ball players and was indented to be a racquet ball facility first and foremost. They said they are willing to share the court with the Teen Center but were opposed to a complete dedication of Racquet Ball Court #1 to the Teen Center. They stated that both courts were generally used from 4-7 PM (the same time the Teen Center is in operation) and that in the past they have accommodated the Teen Center by vacating the court when asked. They also suggested that they would be willing to provide lessons and equipment to any of the kids at the Teen Center that wanted to learn how to play racquet ball.

DISCUSSION:


Both parties made compelling arguments for their respective positions and at the conclusion of meeting it was clear that there was no satisfactory solution to the competing uses.

Staff is at a point in the plan preparation where we are seeking Council direction on the ultimate use of Racquet Ball Court #1 and whether there will be a connecting door to the Teen Center.

Staff recommends that the Teen Center be granted use of the second story of the Monhoff Building (around 800 square feet; the previous located of the Recreation Services office) as additional area for them and that the racquetball courts remain, with the provision that they be allowed for other recreation program activities uses when not needed for racquetball use.
