SPITLER, CITY MANAGER 14 Consideration of a Resolution Approving a Cooperative Joint Powers 15 Agreement to Fund and Administer the "Napa Countywide Storm Water Pollution 16 17 Prevention Program (NCSPPP)" 18 19 **RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt the Resolution. 20 21 BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION: The State of California recently revised the mandated requirements for municipalities that discharge storm water under the General Permit 22 23 administered by the State Water Resources Control Board. This permit is known as the 24 Phase II NPDES permit, or the City's Phase II MS4 storm water permit. 25 26 The storm water permit requirements have increased significantly over the last two 27 years. To ease the burden of compliance with the increased regulations, Calistoga has entered into a partnership for a countywide storm water program entitled "Napa 28 29 Countywide Storm Water Pollution Prevention Program" (NCSPPP), formally the Storm 30 Water JPA. 31

The NCSPPP group consists of Napa County and all of the incorporated cities in Napa

County. The partnering program allows us to keep current with the increased permit

requirements and stay in compliance. Many of our permit compliance requirements are accomplished through the NCSPPP program which makes management of our citywide program more efficient, and less expensive.

NCSPPP has modified this year's agreement to run for a three year period instead of annually. This agreement for FY 15/16 would end in FY17/18. The longer term agreement reduces the administrative effort in preparing annual agreements.

Although the agreement is for a longer period, actual approval of funding will continue to be part of the annual budget process. During budget deliberations, if it is decided we do not to participate for any reason, the agreement can be terminated and the City would be financially obligated for services rendered through the end of the previous fiscal year.

City staff, along with the City attorney have reviewed the terms of the agreement and modified the language to ensure the longer term doesn't financially obligate the City beyond its fair share and is recommending approval of the new agreement.

<u>CONSISTENCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES</u>: The recommended action supports the FY 2015/16 City Council Goal No. 3, Objective 1 by providing a funding mechanism to "...maintain the high level of service and reliability of the City's infrastructure systems and facilities."

FISCAL IMPACT: Calistoga's share of the NCSPPP for FY15/16 is \$27,816 and was included in the approved FY 2015/16 budget. For reference FY14/15 was \$27,576. The FY 15/16 estimated total budget for managing our storm water program is \$106,100, which includes the following:

- State General Permit Fee \$5,834
- City staff costs \$72,450 to manage/implement permit compliance
- NCSPPP/JPA costs \$27.816

16	WHEREAS, in 2003, the City of Calistoga applied for and obtained coverage for
17	City of Calistoga under the State Board's Phase II Permit; and

19	WHEREAS, on February 5, 2013, the State Board adopted a revised Phase II
20 21	Permit, which went into effect on July 1, 2013; and
22	WHEREAS, on June 24, 2013 the City of Calistoga applied for coverage under
23	the new Phase II Permit as required by the State Board; and

25	WHEREAS, to prevent the necessity of each city in the County having to acquire
26 27	a separate NPDES permit, the Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (NCFCWC) has developed the Napa County Stormwater Management Program
28	encompassing the City of Calistoga, City of Napa, City of St. Helena, City of American
29	Canyon, Town of Yountville, and the County of Napa; and

31	WHEREAS, in addition to staff time and the annual State permit, the City of
32	Calistoga's share of the costs for program administration are \$27,816 for fiscal year
33 34	2015/16; and
35	WHEREAS, funds are budgeted in Fiscal Year 2015/16 for these costs; and

37	WHEREAS, the City of Calistoga is authorized under State law to delegate to a
38	designated representative its authority to bind the City under contract; and
39 40	WHEREAS, the City Council wishes to grant authority to the Mayor of the City of
40	Calistoga to execute the Cooperative Joint Powers Agreement to Fund and Administer
