Staff has advertised the "Napa River and Calistoga Community Cleanup Day" on the Calistoga website, in the Calistoga Tribune, and on Channel 28. The Napa County Resource Conservation District has placed a link on their website to Calistoga's website to direct persons in our area to Calistoga's event.

As part of our normal policy when individuals volunteer for the City we have prepared a release/waiver of liability form that all volunteers will be required to sign prior to beginning cleanup work.

Everyone will meet at the Community Center, at 1307 Washington Street, on September 19<sup>th</sup> rain or shine at 9:00 a.m. to sign waivers, get their assignments and tools, and to have coffee and donuts before beginning work. We have received notice of donations in the form of donuts from Calmart, coffee and fixings from Calistoga Roastery, gift bags from the Calistoga Chamber of Commerce, gift cards from Scoops & Swirls, gloves and buckets from Silverado Hardware and labor and donations from Calistoga Rotary.

**FISCAL IMPACT**: The Napa River and Calistoga Community Cleanup Day has been budgeted in FY 15/16 in the amount of \$3,400. It is expected that we will stay well within that budget.

In Calistoga in 2014, 51 volunteers participated in the cleanup event. Throughout Napa County 400 volunteers collected roughly 6,000 pounds of trash and recyclables across 20 miles of Napa County.

If you are interested in participating, please meet at the Community Center parking lot at 1307 Washington Street at 9:00 a.m. Refreshments will be served before we start work.

We plan on working at the following cleanup sites:

- Oat Hill Mine Trailhead (Lincoln @ Silverado Trail)

All volunteers must read and sign a liability waiver before participating in the event. Children under 18 are required to have the form signed by a parent or legal guardian. (The form will be available at meeting site as well). Read it, sign it, and bring it to the event.

#### Important:

- -BYOB! If you can bring your own trash container a bucket, bin, bag, etc. we can cut down on the resources used during our cleanup!
- Garbage bags, pickers and gloves will be provided at the Community Center.
- Water will be available, but please bring your own reusable water bottle!
- Wear sunscreen, a hat and clothes that can get dirty.
- Signed waivers are required.
