ITEM

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- Consideration of a parcel map to divide the property located at 2960 Foothill Boulevard 2
- into 2 parcels, and a use permit amendment and variance to allow the existing 3
- veterinary clinic to be located on a 1-acre parcel. 4

BACKGROUND AND REVISED PROJECT DESCRIPTION 5

- On December 10, 2014, the Planning Commission considered the subject applications 6
- and, following the public hearing, continued the items in order to address concerns 7
- raised by the Planning Commission and the public regarding drainage and vehicular 8
- access. 9
- On October 8, 2015, the applicant resubmitted a revised Project Description, Tentative 10
- Parcel Map, Arborist's Report, Stormwater Control Plan and Drainage Analysis. The 11
- revised Tentative Map proposes to divide the property into two parcels: a 1-acre parcel 12
- containing the veterinary clinic (Parcel 1) and a vacant 1.16-acre parcel (Parcel 2). The 13
- vacant parcel is intended for residential development but would be sold undeveloped. 14
- Access to the vacant parcel would be via a 23-foot wide panhandle portion of Parcel 2 15
- containing drainage, a 20-foot wide chip-seal driveway and utility easement in favor of 16
- Parcel 1. City water would also be extended along the southeastern property line to 17
- service future development and a new septic system would be installed for sewage 18
- disposal on Parcel 2. The water line would be stubbed out to Parcel 2 prior to 19
- recordation of the parcel map and the septic system would be installed at time of 20
- development on Parcel 2. The existing septic system and trash enclosure on Parcel 1 21
- would be relocated to accommodate the proposed driveway and utility improvements. 22
- A use permit amendment and variance are still warranted in order to allow a veterinary 23
- clinic on a 1-acre parcel. The use permit amendment is necessary in order to find that a 24
- 1-acre parcel is an appropriately-sized lot for a veterinary clinic since the Planning 25
- Commission originally approved the use permit finding that the 2-acre parcel was 26
- appropriate. The variance is necessary to allow the reduced parcel size rather than the 27

minimum lot size of 2 acres, as required for veterinary clinics in the RR District per CMC Section 17.14.020(B)(3)(a).

ANALYSIS AND DISCUSSION

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A thorough analysis of the project was presented to the Planning Commission on December 10, 2014 (Attachment 5). Much of the analysis and the recommended conditions of approval are still applicable to the revised project. As such, the following only addresses the concerns raised during the December 10, 2014 meeting and/or matters resulting from the revised tentative parcel map. The draft resolutions show modifications based upon the revised project in tracked changes.

Drainage: Hogan Land Services has prepared a preliminary drainage analysis based on the revised parcel map and in conformance with the City's stormwater regulations. To ensure that the post-construction runoff does not exceed the pre-construction runoff, the existing retention basin will be removed and replaced with three bioretention areas. New flowlines, piping and asphalt berms would also be installed to direct runoff to acceptable locations. Drainage easements would be provided to convey stormwater from Parcel 1 across Parcel 2.

Additionally, since the design and functionality of the drainage system depends on periodic maintenance, a condition of approval has been incorporated into the project requiring a maintenance agreement, which would include cleaning and ensuring flows at the northeast corner of the property are not obstructed (there is a fence in the drainage ditch at this location that catches debris).

The preliminary drainage study demonstrates that the drainage system will not result in impacts. As such, staff is of the opinion that the Planning Commission can find that the two 1-acre project sites are suitable and can accommodate the existing and anticipated development, as conditioned.

<u>Vehicular Access</u>: The revised project would place the driveway and emergency vehicle access (EVA) within the panhandle portion of Parcel 2. An EVA turnaround would also be constructed near the shared property line between Parcel 1 and Parcel 2. The Fire Chief has reviewed this proposal and finds it acceptable. The revised proposal also has less impact on trees and utilities, with exception to the proposed privacy screening along the southern boundary.

The proposed privacy screening along the southeastern property boundary would impact many oak trees. This fence does not appear to be necessary. The existing solid wood-board fence should remain and/or be replaced in its current location after the construction of the driveway. In the event that the fence does not allow a full 20-foot wide driveway, the fence may be installed on top of the proposed asphalt berm. Furthermore, since development is not proposed on Parcel 2, the privacy screening is not necessary beyond the existing fence line. Agricultural fencing should be used in this area to maintain the rural landscape.

Although the proposed driveway would serve the primary access needs of Parcel 1 and 2, the access easement over the adjoining property to the west would still exist. The

property owners may wish to exercise their right to use this easement in the future but 69 since it is unknown at this time if the property owners would use this easement, 70 roadway improvements are not warranted. Moreover, the maintenance agreement for 71 the easement already includes provisions for improvement and maintenance. The 72 affected property owners may wish to invoke the agreement, which would require the 73 property owner to contribute to the maintenance fund. As an alternative, the property 74 owners may wish to terminate the easement since adequate access would be provided 75 along the southern property boundary. 76

FINDINGS

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To reduce repetition, all of the appropriate findings are contained in the attached resolutions.

To date, no written comments have been received regarding the subject applications.

82 ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

These actions are not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the project may have a significant effect on the environment.
