- ISSUE: Consideration of the vacation of a half-width section of Fir Street, and a section
- of Washington Street
- 3 **RECOMMENDATION**: Adopt a resolution declaring the Council's intent to consider the
- 4 vacations and set the matter for a public hearing on April 5, 2016
- 5 BACKGROUND: The City of Calistoga recently purchased the vacant property at 611
- 6 Washington Street in order to develop 30 apartments for low-income seniors.
- A sliver of surplus right-of-way fronting the project site was created by the realignment
- of Washington Street a number of years ago. Additionally, a 30-foot wide section of Fir
- 9 Street that runs along the property's northwestern boundary is a "paper" street that was
- created by the 1871 T.W. Morgan Map. Neither of these rights-of-way are required for
- public purposes and need to be abandoned (vacated) and incorporated into the property
- to facilitate its development.
- Calistoga Municipal Code 12.04.020(A) declares all paper streets to be public streets.
- State law requires jurisdictions to abandon publicly-owned right-of-ways that will not
- forseeably be used for roadway purposes.
- The process for street vacations is defined in Section 8300, et seg. of the California
- Streets and Highway Code and Calistoga Municipal Code 16.16.220. A street vacation
- is a legislative act, and, therefore, final action rests with the City Council. The Planning
- 19 Commission reviews each street vacation request for impacts on citywide circulation,
- 20 conformance with the General Plan Circulation Element and land uses.

- Upon receipt of a recommendation from the Commission, the Council preliminarily determines whether or not the existing right-of-way is necessary for roadway purposes and/or if a portion of the existing right-of-way needs to be reserved for public utilities, storm drains, sanitary sewer lines, water lines, etc. In addition to City reviewing the need to reserve easements, the Council also determines whether or not the right-of-way or parts thereof are useful as a non-motorized transportation facility.
- Subsequent to this preliminary review, the Council adopts a resolution declaring the intention to vacate the street or portions thereof. Upon adoption of the resolution, the City will post a notice declaring this intent on the property and advertise the date of the scheduled public hearing. Following the public hearing, the Council takes action on the street vacation with the adoption of a resolution, which is recorded in the Office of the County Recorder.
- **DISCUSSION**: On January 13, 2016, the Planning Commission held a public hearing 33 on the proposed street vacations and determined that the construction and use of Fir 34 Street and the sliver of Washington Street along the project frontage are not included in 35 the modifications and improvements to Calistoga's street network called for by the 36 General Plan's Circulation Element. Furthermore, Action A1.1-2 of the Element calls for 37 the City to cooperate with landowners to eliminate unnecessary "paper streets." 38 Therefore, the Commission determined that abandonment of these rights-of-way would 39 be consistent with the General Plan. 40
- Additionally, no portions of these rights-of-way need to be reserved for public utilities.
- ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW: The proposed rights-of-way vacations are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, the "general rule" exemption, because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the actions in question may have a significant effect on the environment.
- FISCAL IMPACT: The proposed vacations will allow the development of the subject property with an apartment project, which will have a positive fiscal impact for the City.

38 39 ITS INTENT TO CONDUCT A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE VACATION OF PORTIONS OF FIR AND WASHINGTON STREETS RIGHTS-OF-WAY (SV 2015-1)

WHEREAS, the property at 611 Washington Street (APN 011-260-027) includes a section of Fir Street and a small portion of Washington Street that are not needed for the city's street network; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calistoga desires to vacate these rights-of-way in order to facilitate the development of the property; and

WHEREAS, this action is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the proposed vacations may have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, after a public meeting on January 13, 2016 at which the Planning Commission considered the public record, including the written and oral staff reports, and testimony presented during the meeting, the Commission found that:

- 1. A sliver of surplus right-of-way fronting the project site was created by the realignment of Washington Street a number of years ago and is not required for public purposes.
- A 30-foot wide section of Fir Street along the property's northwestern boundary is a "paper" street that was created by the T.W. Morgan Street Map in the 19th century and is not needed for the city's street network.
- The construction and use of Fir Street and the sliver of Washington Street along the project frontage are not included in the modifications and improvements to Calistoga's street network called for by the General Plan's Circulation Element.
- 4. Circulation Element Action A1.1-2 calls for the City to eliminate unnecessary "paper streets;" and

WHEREAS, no portions of these rights-of-way need to be reserved for public utility purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Calistoga hereby finds and determines that portions of Fir and Washington Streets as described in Exhibits A and B attached to this resolution are unnecessary for future street purposes and declares its intent to consider their vacation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing will be held at the regularly-scheduled City Council meeting of April 1, 2016 for hearing all persons interested in or objecting to the proposed vacations.
