BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION: Through the conditions of approval for the Palisades Subdivision, the City required the establishment of Landscape Maintenance District (LMD) to fund the maintenance of adjacent public landscaping through the levying of assessments on the parcels within those subdivision.

The Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (Streets and Highways Code 22500-22647) requires that the City undertake certain proceedings for any fiscal year during which an assessment is proposed to be levied and collected. These proceedings are usually accomplished through three Council actions as follows:

1) Adopt a resolution directing the City Engineer to prepare and file a report.

2) Approve the Engineer's Report, declare the City Council's intent to levy and collect assessments and set the date for a public hearing.

 Conduct a public hearing and authorize the actual levying and collection of assessments.

The recommended Resolution begins the process for the 2016/2017 assessment. At the June 7th meeting you will receive the Engineer's Report and set the date for a public hearing. During the Public Hearing the Council will receive any public testimony on the proposed assessment and will consider the levy of the proposed assessments.

CONSISTANCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES: The recommended action supports the FY 2016/17 City Council Goal No. 3, Objective 1 by providing a funding mechanism to "...maintain the high level of service and reliability of the City's infrastructure systems and facilities." The LMD provides a funding mechanism for maintenance of the landscaping that benefits the properties in the LMD. Without this funding mechanism, the City would have to consider termination of landscape maintenance or use other discretionary funding to cover the maintenance costs.

FISCAL IMPACT: There will be no fiscal impact through the adoption of the recommended resolution. Actual fiscal impact will be determined after the preparation of the Engineer's Report.
