**Dieter Deiss, 3000 Silverado Trail,** spoke in favor of preserving the railroad tracks and discussed the history of the railroad in Calistoga.

Rich Kettlewell, Franz Valley, spoke in favor of keeping the railroad tracks and their importance as an artifact of Calistoga history.

Dennis McNay, Foothill Blvd., spoke in favor of keeping the tracks.

David Moon-Wainwright, 1210 Pine Street, spoke of the symbolism of the railroad tracks.
