

ISSUE: Consideration of a Resolution that approves a Site Remediation and Reimbursement Agreement for Calistoga Hills Resort LLC ("Developer").

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RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the Resolution.

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BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION: On August 21, 2012, the City adopted three resolutions (2012-063-065) that approved a vesting tentative map for the Calistoga Hills Resort (the Project), a Conditional Use Permit, Design Review, and Planned Development and specific Conditions of Approval for the Project.

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On April 9, 2013 a Development Agreement was executed by the City and the Developer for the Project and the Agreement was recorded on April 18, 2013 in the Napa County Recorder's Office.

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Section 36 of the Conditions of Approval require Developer to enter into a Site Remediation and Reimbursement Agreement with the City prior to commencing construction of the onsite improvements related to the Project ("Project Improvements").

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- The recommended Agreement will satisfy the requirement in Section 36 of the Conditions to provide security for any site remediation costs potentially incurred by the City in the event the Developer does not satisfactorily complete the work.
 - Site Remediation Work includes, but is not limited to, soil stabilization and compaction, planting of trees/vegetation, hydro-seeding, installation of storm water treatment systems, retaining walls and/or other related construction activities reasonably necessary to restore and stabilize the Property to a natural state.
 - A certificate of deposit in the amount of \$527,160 in favor of the City has been placed on file as security until this agreement deemed complete and the security is released by the City.
 - **FISCAL IMPACT:** There is no impact to the General Fund associated with the recommended action. In the event Developer does not complete the required Project Improvements the City has the option of "calling" the Certificate of Deposit due and payable to complete the necessary restoration work.
