SUBJECT: Authorization to Replace Patrol Utility Vehicle for Police

Department for an amount not to exceed \$40,000

ISSUE: Adoption of a Resolution to approve a budget adjustment in the FY 2016/17 Budget Account # 15-4970-4820 from the unappropriated Equipment Replacement Reserves and authorize the expenditures of funds to purchase a replacement patrol vehicle for the Police Department in the amount of not to exceed \$40,000.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the Resolution authorizing the purchase of a marked patrol vehicle and the funds to equip and outfit the vehicle as a patrol vehicle. The marked patrol vehicle (#292) was used to end a deadly threat to both the officer and the community which resulted in the collision and damage of police vehicle #292 beyond repair.

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION: The Police Department currently operates using one (1) electric utility vehicle and five (5) motor vehicles. The five (5) motor vehicles consist of one (1) unmarked vehicle used as an administrative vehicle and four (4) marked patrol vehicles. The four marked patrol vehicles are outfitted to comply with all California regulations. These vehicles are kept in readiness for response to all emergency needs. These vehicles are often driven up to 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

On July 12, 2016 patrol vehicle #292 was being driven by patrol officer Luis Paniagua, assigned to dayshift patrol. At approximately 2:20 PM the Calistoga Police Department received a Be-On-The-Lookout for a dark blue Suburban involved in an armed robbery of an armored truck in Windsor, CA. The armed robbery involved a White male and Latino male suspects armed with an AR15 style weapon. At approximately 2:25 PM, Officer Paniagua observed the described Suburban enter Calistoga via Petrified Forest Road. Officer Paniagua followed the suspect vehicle on to Mitzi Drive and was waiting for cover officers when the suspect vehicle went around the block and passed Officer Paniagua on Mitzi Drive. When Officer Paniagua turned around to follow the suspect vehicle the suspect vehicle immediately stopped. The driver of the suspect vehicle immediately got out of the vehicle and began walking back towards the approaching police vehicle. Before Officer Paniagua could stop his vehicle the white male suspect shot at officer Paniagua. Officer Paniagua having no opportunity to engage the suspect used his vehicle to end the deadly threat to both him and the community. Officer Paniagua hit the suspect with his vehicle and subsequently a tree in the front yard of a nearby residence. Patrol vehicle #292 received significant damage to the front of the vehicle (see attached photos of damage). The damage sustained to the vehicle was beyond repair. Both suspects were apprehended and the weapons and stolen money recovered.

Vehicle #292 was a 2014 Ford Explorer Interceptor SUV with 21,594 miles. The Police Department now only has three operational marked units, down from an authorized 5 marked police cars. It is important to have vehicle #292 replaced as it allows the patrol vehicles to be rotated in and out of service to extend the life of the patrol vehicles as well as have marked patrol cars available when there is a need for multiple marked police cars when working patrol and special events.

CONSISTENCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES: This request supports and furthers the City Council's Goal of "Offer excellent professional services to all customers". The replacement of this patrol vehicle directly impacts the police department's ability to provide excellent and professional emergency police & city services in a reliable manner.

FISCAL IMPACT: The price of a new Patrol Utility Vehicle is approximately \$31,000. The outfitting, graphics, and emergency response equipment is estimated at approximately \$9,000. Some of equipment needed to outfit the new patrol vehicle will be reused from the patrol vehicle being replaced. A budget adjustment is requested in an amount not to exceed \$40,000 from the unappropriated Equipment Replacement Reserves under Account # 15-4970-4820. The City is eligible for partial reimbursement for the purchase of vehicle and equipment damaged by the collision via the City's insurance carrier, PARSAC.

reimbursed for a portion of the purchase and equipment caused by the collision
via the City's insurance carrier, PARSAC.
