Local Agency Formation Commissions (LAFCOs) are independent government 7 agencies that were created by State legislation in 1963. LAFCOs were formed to 8 facilitate and encourage the orderly formation of local government agencies, discourage 9 urban sprawl and preserve agricultural and open space resources. 10 responsible for reviewing, approving, or disapproving changes in organization 11 (boundaries) to cities and special districts including annexations, detachments, new 12 formations and incorporations. A LAFCO operates in each county within California 13 except San Francisco. 14

15 Municipal Service Review

The Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 directs that LAFCOs review and update each local agency's Sphere of Influence every five years as needed. As a prerequisite to a Sphere review, LAFCOs must prepare a Municipal Service Review (MSR). The intent of the MSR is to evaluate the adequacy, efficiency, and effectiveness of services in relationship to local needs and circumstances. It is presented in written form and includes a statement of determinations with respect to each of the following points:

- The present and planned land uses in the area;
- The present and probable need for public services and facilities in the area;
- The present capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services that the agency provides;
- The existence of any social or economic communities of interest in the area if LAFCO determines that they are relevant to the service provider; and



The presence of disadvantaged unincorporated communities for those agencies that provide water, wastewater, or structural fire protection services.

The County of Napa LAFCO has prepared a Draft MSR for Calistoga evaluating the adequacy and range of governmental services that are being provided within the City's planning area and has made preliminary written determinations involving service factors (Chapter 6) that LAFCO must consider as part of the MSR.

Sphere of Influence Update

State planning law encourages cities to look beyond their jurisdictional boundaries (city limits) when conducting long range planning efforts. For this reason, the City's General Plan includes an area known as the "Planning Area" which is larger than the city limits (Attachment 1). The Planning Area includes land that the City has determined bears some relation to the City's planning efforts. It encompasses most of the upper Napa Valley, as well as the hillsides that surround Calistoga on three sides. The Planning Area contains visual and open space resources that are an asset to the City as well physical facilities and conditions that are important to the health, safety and welfare of the community. Although the City has no regulatory authority within the Planning Area, adoption of a Planning Area boundary signals to the County and other governmental agencies that Calistoga has recognized that development in the Planning Area has an impact on the future of the City. Under State law, the City is invited to comment on development within the Planning Area that is subject to review by the County.



Current City Limits:
Encompasses incorporated territory where land use is controlled by the city.

City's Sphere of influence:
Adopted by the LAFCO, encompasses incorporated and unincorporated territory that is the city's ultimate service area.

City's Planning Area Boundary:
Encompasses incorporated and unincorporated territory bearing a relation to the city's planning. The planning area may extend beyond the sphere of influence.

Within the Planning Area is the City's "Sphere of Influence". A Sphere of Influence ("Sphere" or "SOI") is a planning boundary that designates the City's probable future boundary and service area. The purpose of the Sphere is to ensure the provision of efficient services while discouraging urban sprawl and the premature conversion of agricultural and open space lands by preventing overlapping iurisdictions and duplication of services. The adjoining figure illustrates the theoretical relationship between the Planning Area, Sphere of Influence and city limits.

Currently, the City's Sphere is coterminous with its city limits with the exception of one City-owned parcel on the eastern edge of the city. It is not uncommon (and more the norm) for a city to have a Sphere that extends beyond city limits.

DISCUSSION

73 Study Areas:

LAFCO's review of the City's Sphere presents an opportunity to discuss revisions that may be needed to accommodate planned population and employment growth, public facility needs or other social/economic interests. As such, LAFCO established three study areas to reflect Calistoga's outside water service area, which extends north of the City along State Highway 128, Petrified Forest Road, and Tubbs Lane, among other areas as shown in Figure 7-1. The merits in establishing these study areas relates to the role of the Sphere in designating each agency's present and probable future service area. Traditionally, cities have been required to request and receive written approval from LAFCO before providing new or extended services by contract or agreement outside their jurisdictions but within their spheres. However, Government Code Section 56133.5 establishes a pilot program to authorize service provision outside a local agency's jurisdictional boundary and sphere of influence under special circumstances. So expanding the Sphere of Influence to provide new or extended services to these properties may not be necessary at this time.

As a result of Government Code Section 56133.5 and Policy P4.1-1 in the General Plan that states that "annexation of any unincorporated land shall be discouraged", LAFCO has indicated that the expansion of the SOI is not necessary at this time. Furthermore, the overall benefit of expanding the Sphere is minimal. The City would receive additional property tax revenue but the costs incurred with providing services (e.g., roadway maintenance and emergency services) would potentially exceed that revenue. The development potential in these study areas would also be limited to large lot residential subdivisions, which would not service a community need.

However, should the Planning Commission find that expanding the city's Sphere is logical and appropriate at this time, a recommendation to expand the Sphere may be forwarded to the City Council for consideration.

Future Steps:

Should the City Council and LAFCO ultimately agree on expanding the Sphere to incorporate one or more of the study areas, a formal process would be initiated that would involve the subsequent review by the Planning Commission, City Council and LAFCO. The public would have additional opportunities to comment on the expansion at public hearings before each decision-making body. The process would also require amendment of the City's General Plan to reflect the expanded Sphere boundary and to designate appropriate land uses within each expansion area.

It is important to note that expansion of the Sphere does not automatically trigger annexation proceedings nor will it result in the taking of private property. As explained earlier, the Sphere is simply a boundary that designates the City's probable future boundary and service area. Any subject areas included in an expanded Sphere would remain unincorporated until such time when the property owner or the City initiates annexation proceedings.
