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ISSUE: Consideration of a Resolution approving and adopting a Sanitary Sewer Management Plan for the City of Calistoga.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION: The Bay Area Clean Water Agencies (BACWA) worked with the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) in a collaborative effort to find ways to reduce and prevent sanitary sewer overflows. This effort resulted in the development of Sanitary Sewer Management Plan (SSMP) guidelines and ultimately in the RWQCB requiring agencies to prepare SSMPs. On June 7, 2005, the City received a letter from the RWQCB notifying us that, as a Sanitary Sewer Collection System Agency, we were required to prepare a SSMP.

The notification letter also included a schedule for the preparation of the SSMP that required elements 1 through 4 to be completed by August 31, 2006, elements 5 through 7 to be completed by August 31, 2007, elements 8 and 9 to be completed by August 31, 2008 and element 10 to be completed by November 2, 2009.

The City completed and approved a Sanitary Sewer Management Plan on May 4, 2010.

22 23 SSMPs are required to include the following ten elements: 24 25 1. Goals 26 2. Organization 27 3. Overflow Emergency Response Plan 28 4. Fats, Oil, and Grease (FOG) Control Program 29 5. Legal Authority 30 6. Measures and Activities 31 7. Design and Construction Standards 32 8. Capacity Management 33 9. Monitoring, Measurement, and Program Modifications 34 10. SSMP Audits 35 36 The SSMP is updated annually. However, Council is required to approve an 37 updated SSMP every five years. 38 39 Staff has conducted the review of the SSMP with the help of Larry Walker 40 Associates, the City's consultant for sewer collection and treatment issues. 41 42 Staff recommends that the attached 2016 Sanitary Sewer Management Plan be 43 approved and accepted by the City Council. 44 FISCAL IMPACT: The FOG program and outreach activities will be ongoing as 45 46 are the regular activities of sewer main inspection, etc. These mandatory SSMP activities will consume undetermined amounts of staff time and resources and will be 47 48 budgeted through the Sewer Collection Budget 03-4141. 49 50 **ATTACHMENTS:** 51 1.
