**SUBJECT:** Consideration of a Resolution authorizing the purchase of a

pedestrian/bicycle bridge for temporary use during the construction of Berry Street Bridge Replacement Project, authorizing a budget adjustment, adopting findings contained in Caltrans Form 12-F, and authorizing City Manager to execute a purchase order to buy the

pedestrian/bicycle bridge.

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**ISSUE**: Consideration of a Resolution authorizing the purchase of a pedestrian/bicycle bridge for temporary use during the construction of Berry Street Bridge Replacement Project, authorizing a budget adjustment, adopting Caltrans Form 12-F, and authorizing the City Manager to execute a purchase order to buy the pedestrian/bicycle bridge.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt the Resolution.

**BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION**: Berry Street Bridge crosses the Napa River just south of the Washington/Berry/3<sup>rd</sup> Street intersection, in the City of Calistoga. This bridge is over 97 years old and structurally/seismically deficient and needs replacement. Funding for 100% of the replacement would come from the Federal Highway Bridge Replacement (HBR) fund and bridge toll credits.

The City hired Mark Thomas and Company (MTCo) to complete the design of the bridge and they are finalizing the design/permitting so the project can be bid next spring (2017) with construction beginning in June 2017. It is anticipated to be a five month

construction project, from demolition to installation of the new bridge, with a forecast completion date of November 2017.

One of the necessary facilities identified by the community (community forum on September 18, 2013), was the need to install a Temporary Bicycle/Pedestrian Bridge (TBPB) during construction to maintain a physical crossing. The environmental document also requires a pedestrian bridge be installed to maintain pedestrian access. As previously noted, the existing bridge is heavily used by the public to access the existing Elementary School, Church, Park and residences. The temporary bridge is also critical in that it will be used to support temporary utilities (i.e. gas, electric, water, recycled water) that need to be maintained during construction.

Staff has identified two options for Council consideration:

- 1. Option 1 Rent a TBPB \$48,202 (est.); with 100% grant funding
- 2. Option 2 Calistoga Purchases the TBPB for \$101,231
  - a. Best Case Grant covers full rental cost (a maximum of \$48,202)
  - b. Worst Case The Grant covers 0% of the purchase cost

 MTCo has received rental pricing from ASCROW bridges with a quotation of \$48,202 (see attached). We also went through a competitive bid process to determine the purchase price of the bridge (see attached). Three bids were received from different suppliers and the lowest responsible bid was determined to be from Excel Bridge Manufacturing Co for \$101,230.56 (includes delivery and tax). If Council selects this option a budget adjustment of \$112,000 is recommended which includes a 10% contingency.

If Council prefers Option 1 (renting the TBPB) the HBR program and toll credits will fully fund the cost of the bridge rental but there will be no bridge at the end of the project to re-purpose elsewhere in the City. If Council prefers Option 2, it should be noted that Calistoga will bear the full costs of the purchase (\$112,000) with the potential of a partial reimbursement, if approved by Caltrans, up to a maximum of \$48,202 (the equivalent cost of the rental quote). The balance of \$63,798 would be the City responsibility.

 In order for Caltrans to determine our eligibility for partial reimbursement of the TBPB, the attached 12-F form "Cost-Effectiveness Determination/Public Interest Finding" has to be adopted by Council, and reviewed by Caltrans for partial funding. This form is attached and provided for consideration and adoption under Option 2.

Option 2 has a critical path component since it takes approximately five months to order, build, and deliver the bridge. To construct the Berry Street Bridge replacement starting in June, 2017, the temporary bridge would need to be purchased no later than January 2017.

Given the desire to provide an alternate method of crossing the river at the Community Center and Pioneer Park in-lieu of the low water crossing, staff is recommending Council adopt the resolution selecting Option 2, approve a budget adjustment in the amount of \$112,000 to purchase the TBPB, adopt Caltrans 12-F form, and authorize the City Manager to execute a purchase order with Excel Bridge Manufacturers. This option allows the bridge to be re-purposed after the Berry Street Bridge project for beneficially use by the community as a permanent structure. There is guarantee of partial reimbursement through Caltrans, but this option satisfies multiple objections, including the ultimate removal of the fish barrier presented by the low water crossing.

**GENERAL PLAN CONSISTENCY:** This project is consistent with General Plan Section 7 - Infrastructure – Circulation, Part F – Goals, objectives, policies and actions, which provide as follows:

Goal CIR-1 – Maintain and enhance Calistoga's street network to serve existing and planned land uses while also maintaining the community's small-town character.

Objective CIR-1.1 – Develop Calistoga's street network of arterials, collectors, and primary local and local streets as discussed in Section C of the Circulation Element.

<u>CEQA/NEPA COMPLIANCE</u>: MTCo and Environmental Science Associates (ESA) completed CEQA and NEPA as required by Federal and State regulations in February 2016.

**FISCAL IMPACT**: The project is 100% grant funded between Federal Highway Bridge funds (88.5%) and State Bridge Toll Monies (11.5%, off-system bridge), which are all administered by Caltrans Local Area Assistance Program.

The rental bridge cost of \$48,202 is included in the FY 16/17 Streets Capital Improvement budget item #25-5518-4905 and reimbursed 100% by the HBR grant.

If Council decides to purchase the bridge (Option 2) the recommended resolution includes a budget transfer adjustment in the amount of \$112,000 derived from General Fund contingencies, Fund # 01-4700-4799 to fund 25-3299 and an expenditure appropriation to the FY 16/17 Capital Improvement Project Account # 25-5518-4905.

#### **RESOLUTION 2016-XXX**

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RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALISTOGA, COUNTY OF NAPA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A PEDESTRIAN/BICYCLE BRIDGE FOR USE DURING THE BERRY STREET BRIDGE REPLACEMENT CONSTRUCTION PROJECT AND MAKING PUBLIC INTEREST AND **COST EFFECTIVNESS FINDINGS** 

WHEREAS, the Berry Street Bridge is one of only two downtown Napa River crossings and is a critical vehicle, pedestrian and utility crossing; and

WHEREAS, the City's only other downtown bridge that crosses the Napa River is on Lincoln Avenue/Highway 29 1,200 feet downstream of Berry Street and is scheduled for replacement by Caltrans beginning in 2017; and

WHEREAS, one of the elements of the Berry Street Bridge Replacement Project is installation of a temporary pedestrian bridge downstream of the current bridge location to allow access to the Elementary School, residential areas south and west of the Napa River and to support temporary utilities during the Berry Street Bridge reconstruction; and

WHEREAS, reconstruction of the Berry Street Bridge is due to begin in the summer of 2017 and the temporary pedestrian/bicycle bridge is a critical path item; and

WHEREAS, Caltrans administers the Highway Bridge Replacement Program (HBP) grant funding and has indicated that the grant funds will pay for the lower cost of bridge rental, which has been determined to be just under \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, three bids were received for purchase of a pedestrian bridge with Excel Bridge Manufacturing Co. being the lowest responsible bidder in the amount of \$101,231 (including sales tax); and

WHEREAS, Caltrans has indicated that it is necessary to complete Form 12-F for review by Caltrans to determine if a portion of a purchased bridge would qualify for funding under the HBP grant; and

WHEREAS, in order to document that there is a public benefit and cost effectiveness associated with purchasing a pedestrian bridge that can be repurposed certain findings need to be made; and

WHEREAS, in order to purchase the bridge a budget adjustment derived from General Fund contingencies needs to be approved in the amount of \$112,000 (includes contingency) to pay for the bridge in the event Caltrans doesn't approve partial funding equivalent to the estimated rental cost; and

WHEREAS, due to the lead time for manufacturing of the pedestrian bridge being approximately 5 months, it is necessary to order/purchase the bridge by January 2017; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Calistoga approves:
