<u>DISCUSSION</u>: The City Council has long recognized and supported the UpValley Family Centers (UVFC) and its value and service to the community. In Calistoga, the UVFC already provides health and social services that are not easily accessible to our residents through county or state agencies. Services provided by the UVFC range from Clinic Olé, child and family counseling, to housing assistance services. UVFC, with offices in Calistoga and St. Helena, provide important and essential services to the Calistoga community which the City of Calistoga does not have the ability, expertise or staff to provide.

Recently, UVFC has experienced a significant increase in demand for assistance with immigration related needs by Calistoga residents, mostly due to stated or proposed changes in implementation of federal immigration laws. Residents in the community are expressing worry, fear and serious concerns for themselves and/or their loved ones based on pronouncements at the federal level related to changes immigration policy and enforcement. Between January and April, the demand for services at UVFC has increased over 300% compared with the entire 2016 calendar year. From January-December 2016, UVFC served a total of 88 Calistoga residents with citizenship applications, general consultations and educational workshops. From January 2017 to April 15, 2017, UVFC served 390 Calistoga residents with citizenship applications, U Visas, general consultations, educational workshops, and support completing family preparedness plans. Demand for immigration services is expected to remain high for the foreseeable future and affects the entire community.

31 32 This funding (\$30,000) will be used to increase staff capacity in Calistoga offices to two (2) days/week for immigration services and covers salary and benefits – one day/week for an Immigration Program Coordinator, and one day/week for a Program Director to serve Calistoga

- residents. Staff are bilingual, knowledgeable of the community, trained in immigration law and are partially-accredited representatives by the Board of Immigration Appeals/US Department of Justice.
- Staff recommends execution of the attached Professional Services Agreement enabling the UpValley Family Centers to maintain its formalized relationship with the City of Calistoga.
- FISCAL IMPACT: Funds not to exceed \$30,000 (01-4107-4479) have been budgeted for this professional services contract for Fiscal Year 2017-18.
