BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION: Recently the City has received two requests for parking accommodations. First, a request for time-limited parking at Pioneer Park. The Friends of Pioneer Park have recently completed Phases II and III of the park restoration which included placement of sod, new irrigation system and landscape plantings and the Park reopened on June 9, 2017.

One of the major events held at the park is the Thursday evening Concert in the Park series June through August sponsored by the Calistoga Chamber of Commerce (Chamber). On-street parking on Cedar Street is first come-first serve with no time limit, and it is sometimes difficult for seniors or disabled individuals to get dropped off at a convenient location to attend the concert.

Last year the Chamber of Commerce conducted a trial passenger loading zone on Cedar Street at the main entrance to the park to provide two spaces as a convenient amenity to individuals coming to the concert. The popularity of the Concert in the Park is increasing and drawing several hundred participants per event and the Chamber has requested the two-space passenger loading zone become permanent during the concert series. The use of two parking spaces during the concert series would not materially affect parking in the area during the concerts, and would not affect parking during other times.

Staff is recommending adoption of a Resolution as authorized in Section 10.36.080 of the Municipal Code that restricts parking on Cedar Street to five minutes on Thursdays, June through August between the houses of 5:30 PM and 8 PM establishing a passenger loading zone. The recommended Resolution also directs the Public Works Department to install signage and directs the Police Department to begin parking enforcement after the signs are installed.

The second request for a parking accommodation was received by staff and then by Council on May 16th during public comment period. Jodie Hunt, of Wellspring Physical Therapy (1338 Lincoln Ave.) requested the City designate two (2) parking spaces in the public parking lot behind the fire station for medical facility.

Throughout the duration of the Lincoln Avenue Bridget project, CalTRANS requires a portion of the City's public parking lot to be used for construction staging. Thirty two (32) parking spaces are temporarily "lost" for the 30-month construction project.

Adjacent to the public lot is the physical therapy business, one of the few medical facilities in Calistoga. The business owner claims the business is adversely impacted by losing the adjacent thirty two (32) spaces and physical therapy patients are unable to find parking, making it difficult to visit the location. In addition, patients may suffer from either permanent or temporary disability_or discomfort and lack of available parking may force patients to park much further away. As the facility serves numerous Medicare recipients and is required to have adequate parking, the requestor has asked the City Council and staff to consider an accommodation by restricting two (2) spaces for their use.

The City Attorney's Office has reviewed this request and while the Municipal Code is unclear, the City does have has the authority to designate two spaces in its lot for this particular business. Generally, the California Vehicle Code provides broad authority for the City to regulate parking on its streets and within municipal lots, including the authority to give preferential parking privileges to nearby merchants (CA Vehicle Code Sections 22507 and 22519).

Considering a business owner has made this request to temporarily designate parking for her business, and that the Council may have a desire to

accommodate patients of the facility, the Council can consider and/or approve this request.

consistency with city council goals and objectives: The recommended action supports the FY 2017/18 City Council Goal No. 1, Objective 2, "...Promote the qualities of Calistoga that are attractive to residents and visitors". Establishing a passenger loading zone for the Concert in the Park event, and also designating two parking spaces for use of the physical therapy business, provide a safe and effective way for members of the community, including seniors and persons with disabilities, to attend the popular event and park vehicles for the duration of physical therapy sessions, respectively.

FISCAL IMPACT: The cost to purchase and install the required signs at Pioneer Park is approximately \$150 and will come from the account 01-4122-4401. The Chamber has agreed to reimburse the City for the cost of the signs.

The cost to purchase and install temporary signs at the public lot behind the fire station would be paid by the City.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALISTOGA, COUNTY OF NAPA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA,

ESTABLISHING A FIVE MINUTE PASSENGER LOADING ZONE ON CEDAR STREET AT PIONEER PARK; AND DESIGNATING TWO, TEMPORARY PARKING SPACES IN A PUBLIC LOT FOR A PHYSICAL THERAPY BUSINESS

WHEREAS, the Friends of the Pioneer Park have recently completed Phases II and III of the park restoration which included placement of sod, new irrigation system and landscape plantings; and

WHEREAS, the Calistoga Chamber of Commerce sponsors the Thursday evening Concert in the Park at Pioneer Park from June through August; and

WHEREAS, last year the Chamber of Commerce conducted a trial passenger loading zone on Cedar Street at the main entrance to the park; and

WHEREAS, the popularity of the Concert in the Park is increasing and drawing several hundred participants per event and the Chamber has requested the passenger loading zone become permanent during the concert series; and

WHEREAS, on-street parking on Cedar Street is first come-first serve with no time limit, and it is sometimes difficult for seniors or disabled individuals to get dropped off at a convenient location to attend the concert; and

WHEREAS, Section 10.36.080 of the Calistoga Municipal Code authorizes the City Council, by resolution, to restrict parking to certain time limits in designated areas; and

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Sections 22507 and 22519 provides broad authority for the City to regulate parking on its streets and within municipal lots, including the authority to give preferential parking privileges to nearby merchants; and

WHEREAS, CalTRANS requires a portion of the City's public parking lot to be used for construction staging which temporarily reduces public parking by thirty two (32) parking spaces for the 30-month construction project; and

WHEREAS, an adjacent business which serves members of the public who are senior, with permanent/temporarily disability, are receiving medical services, are adversely impacted by temporary loss of public parking; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a passenger loading zone on Cedar Street, and designating two parking spaces for a physical therapy business, would not materially affect parking in the area during the concerts or business, respectively; and

WHEREAS, the recommended actions are general policy and procedure and are not a Project under CEQA pursuant to Section 15378(b) (4) of CEQA; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Calistoga hereby stablishes a five minute passenger loading zone on Cedar Street at Pioneer Park, June through August on Thursday evenings between the hours of 5:30 pm and 8 pm


