**ISSUE**: Council review and consideration of a Resolution approving the City of 1 Calistoga Annex to the County of Napa Emergency Operations Plan. 2

- **RECOMMENDATION:** Adopt the Resolution. 3
- **BACKGROUND**: The City of Calistoga is located in the Napa County Operational Area 4
- which is comprised of six jurisdictions that have a strong working relationship. Cities of 5
- Napa, St. Helena, American Canyon, Calistoga and the Town of Yountville are 6
- incorporated jurisdictions within the area of Napa County. The County of Napa is 7
- responsible for all non-incorporated area in the county. 8
- On January 23, 2001 and with updates occurring over the past decade, the Napa 9
- County Board of Supervisors adopted the Napa County Emergency Operations Plan 10
- (EOP). The objective of the EOP is to incorporate and coordinate the best possible 11
- approaches to response and recovery in light of major emergencies such as flooding, 12
- wildfire and earthquakes so these approaches can be rapidly and effectively applied as 13 resources become available. The use of state and national standard approaches to
- 14 disaster management allows the County to seamlessly incorporate resources outside
- 15
- the County in times of critical need, to protect private and public property and minimize 16
- the impact on the environment. 17
- **DISCUSSION**: Currently, the County of Napa is leading the effort to update the EOP 18
- which would be a collaborative effort among the jurisdictions in Napa County and would 19
- include an Annex that details each participating jurisdiction's specific plans and 20
- emergency preparedness/response information. 21

- The County of Napa EOP is comprised of three Sections: The Base Plan, EOC Guidance Documents/ EOC Position Guides/Checklists, and Annexes from participating jurisdictions.
- Section 1, the Base Plan, is comprised of four major parts:
  - 1. An overview that discusses hazard mitigation and emergency situations. The County of Napa adopted the Napa County Operational Area Hazard Mitigation Plan 2013-18 and distributed copies at the October 8, 2015 Operational Area meeting. The City of Calistoga joined the County on this plan by Resolution on May 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014.
  - 2. The fundamentals of command management for an emergency operations center that include the National Incident Management System, Standard Emergency Management System and Incident Command System.
  - 3. The principles of operations in the EOC.
  - 4. Recovery plans from an emergency incident.
  - Section 2 contains documents vital to Emergency Operations Center (EOC) operations. These documents include position guides and checklists for each of the possible positions in the EOC. These documents aid staff members through their respective responsibilities during all phases of the incident including activation of the EOC, operational phase and the demobilization phase.
- Section 3 is made up of Annexes containing the specific information for each of the participating jurisdictions, including EOC locations, shift assignments and call back lists, as well as any jurisdiction specific response plans.
- 44 CONSISTENCY WITH COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES: The proposed EOP 45 would help fulfill Goal 2 of the City Council's goals and objectives for Fiscal Year 2017-46 18, which calls, in part for providing a high standard in the delivery of emergency and 47 general municipal services.
