BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION:

On July 3, 2007, the City Council approved a the Final Map for a four lot land division of an existing six (6) acre parcel located at 1857 Money Lane.

The developer entered into a Subdivision Improvement Agreement in order to record the final map prior to construction of the public improvements.

The construction of the public improvements has now been completed in accordance with the approved plans and City standards. As-built drawings have been prepared and are on file in the Public Works Department.
