Drug/Alcohol Prevention Education Program Services.

APPROVAL FOR FORWARDING:

ISSUE: Consideration of a Resolution Authorizing a Professional Services Agreement with the UpValley Family Centers in an amount not to exceed \$25,000, to provide contracted Juvenile Diversion Program and Drug/Alcohol Prevention Education Program Services. The Professional Services Agreement includes the provision of services to both the City of Calistoga and City of St. Helena.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution.

BACKGROUND / DISCUSSION: In 1997, the City of Calistoga and the City of St. Helena partnered to contract Juvenile Diversion Services with the Boys & Girls Club of St. Helena and Calistoga. The Boys & Girls club hired a Juvenile Diversion Officer to coordinate the Juvenile Diversion program at an annual compensation of \$50,000, each city contributing \$25,000 annually. In April 2017, the Boys & Girls Club could no longer provide these services. Both the City of Calistoga and City of St. Helena found themselves without a Juvenile Diversion Officer to coordinate the Juvenile Diversion program. Both the Calistoga and St. Helena Police Departments determined they did not have the resources to

manage the program internally due to staffing resource limitations and current legal mandates required by California Proposition 64, the Marijuana Legalization Initiative, requiring specific education, counseling, and community service of juveniles illegally possessing marijuana. The Calistoga and St. Helena police departments engaged in identifying potential vendors with the ability to provide Juvenile Diversion Services (see attached Scope of Work).

The Napa County Juvenile Diversion Officer operating out of the Napa Police Department offered to assist but did not have the capacity to coordinate the Juvenile Diversion Program for either the City of Calistoga or the City of St. Helena. The Aldea Counseling Services located in the City of Napa showed interest but was limited in providing services within the City year-round beyond counseling. Cobert Safety & Professional Services a for-profit counseling services & education provider offered to assist but could not meet all services of the Scope of Work and was based in Sonoma County. The UpValley Family Centers provided a written proposal to coordinate the Juvenile Diversion Program for both the City of Calistoga and City of St. Helena (see attached UpValley Family Center Proposal). The UpValley Family Centers met all aspects of the Scope of Work and offered to provide the services for \$50,000 annually with additional funding only as authorized by the Professional Services Agreement.

The UpValley Family Centers (UVFC) has offices in both the City of Calistoga and City of St. Helena. UVFC provides existing counseling and education services and programs in both communities and Unified School Districts. UVFC has existing partnerships with local and county service providers and has long been established in both communities. UVFC can provide "wrap around" services for both juveniles and their families. Overall, the UVFC has a good reputation in both communities and is well positioned to provide Juvenile Diversion Services (see attached UFVC proposal).

<u>CONSISTENCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES</u>: Offer excellent professional services to all customers.

FISCAL IMPACT: The City of Calistoga's compensation to the UpValley Family Centers per the Professional Services Agreement shall not exceed \$25,000 per fiscal year for the Juvenile Diversion Program and Drug/Alcohol Prevention Education Program services unless additional compensation is approved in accordance with section 2 of the Professional Services Agreement. The \$25,000 has been included in the FY 17-18 Budget; \$12,500 under account no. 01-4116-4402, and \$12,500 under account no. 41-4659-4433.
