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ISSUE: Consideration of a Resolution approving an agreement with Richard Dwyer (Applicant) for water line construction related to the Francis House Restoration Project at 1403 Myrtle Street.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt the Resolution.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION: During permit review for the Francis House Renovation project, it was determined that the existing 2" steel pipe water line on Myrtle Street between Lincoln Avenue and Berry Street would need to be replaced in order to supply sufficient water for domestic and fire flow needs of the project and surrounding areas. There are 6" dead-end water lines extending from Foothill to Myrtle on Berry Street and on Spring Street. The line on Spring Street does not have adequate fire flows.

The City's Municipal Code (13.04.170 F.1) requires developers to construct utilities along their entire frontage and further states the frontage improvements are not subject to reimbursement or credit by the City. For the subject property the Myrtle frontage is approximately 120 feet.

A condition of approval for the project requires the Applicant to install approximately 440 lineal feet of 8" water line connecting the two dead-end 6" lines. The Applicant was also required to install appurtenances and "switch over" at least four water service laterals that are connected to the 2" steel line that will be replaced by the new 8" water main.

The estimated cost to install the 8" water main, appurtenances and the connections is approximately \$180,000 or \$409/ft. The value of the frontage improvement is \$49,080 (120 ft X \$409/ft) and is the responsibility of the Applicant.

In addition to other impact fees, the Applicant was responsible for \$34,772.60 and \$72,950.39 in water and wastewater capacity fees respectively and was required to pay \$36,294.99 in wastewater capacity fees.

Staff proposes that the Applicant be reimbursed/credited \$130,920 (\$180,000 - \$49,080) towards the water line installation. The amount of credit would be \$34,772.60 from the water connection fee and a credit of \$36,665.40 from the wastewater connection fee for a total of \$71,438.

At the completion of the water line construction a reconciling audit comparing actual costs incurred will be conducted and the Applicant would be reimbursed for expenses incurred less credits to date. The estimated balance to be reimbursed is \$59,482 (\$130,920 - \$71,438).

Installation of the 8" water line along the full block of Myrtle Street between Spring Street and Berry Street will provide the following benefits to the Water Distribution System:

- Replaces an old 2" steel line that is undersized, prone to water leaks, and beyond its useful life
- "Loops" two dead-end water lines thereby improving water supply reliability
- Improves fire flows on Berry and Spring between Myrtle and Foothill
- Improves fire flows on Myrtle between Berry and Spring Streets

CONSISTENCY WITH CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND OBJECTIVES: This project is consistent with City Council Goal #3: Establish, improve and maintain City infrastructure.

FISCAL IMPACT: At the time of permit issuance for the 1403 Myrtle Street project the City would have received the Water and Sewer Connection fees and made available for Capital Improvement Projects. However, given the 2" steel line is undersized and beyond its useful life it is desirable to install a new water main in Myrtle Street between Spring Street and Berry Street now, using capacity fees owed by the Applicant and fund balances. The net fiscal impact to the Water Enterprise is the addition of an asset valued at \$180,000 for an investment of \$130,920.

Funds are budgeted in the Water Capital Account No. 12-5490-4915 in the amount of \$25,000 and in the Water Capital Account No. 12-5513-4915 in the amount of \$25,000 leaving an estimated balance unfunded of \$9,482. When the project has been completed and the audit has been conducted, Staff will come back to the Council with a budget adjustment request for the additional funds needed from unappropriated fund balances.

WHEREAS, funds are currently available in Water Capital Account No. 12-5490-4915 in the amount of \$25,000 and Water Capital Account No. 12-5513-4915 in the amount of \$25,000, leaving an estimated balance of \$9,482; and

WHEREAS, once the audit has been completed and the actual balance is known, Staff will come back to Council for a budget adjustment to complete the funding.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- The City Council of the City of Calistoga resolves that an Agreement be approved with Richard Dwyer for installation of an 8" water line along Myrtle Street between Spring Street and Berry Street related to the Francis House Renovation Project at 1403 Myrtle Street.
- That a credit in the amount of \$34,772.60 from the Water Connection Fee 2. and \$36,665.40 from the Wastewater Connection fee be given to Richard Dwyer for installation of the water line along Myrtle Street that does not front the subject property at 1403 Myrtle Street.
- 3. That a reconciling audit will be conducted after the installation of the water line is complete to verify the actual cost of the construction and a reimbursement will be issued to the Applicant for any cost that exceed the credits given, and the valuation of his frontage obligation.
- That upon completion of the project and the reconciling audit, a budget adjustment will be brought back to Council for approval to complete the funding.
