**NCSMP Stormwater Program Specialist Betourne** provided an overview of the City's water supply including the City's primary water sources and usage. He stated that the City will continue to implement its current Stormwater Management Program until a new Phase II National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit is developed.

 Administrative Services Director Spilman presented the staff report and stated that staff hired a contractor to abate the nuisance on the Karpuk's property after repeated attempts to work with the property owners.

Mayor Gingles stated for the record that the property owners were not present for this public hearing item.

Assistant City Attorney Winig stated that all the abatement processes were followed according to the City's Municipal Code and the State Government Code,

Matthew Moye, 1718 Mora Avenue (Planning Commission applicant), stated that he graduated from law school with an emphasis in Land Use and Planning; he gained experience clerking for a firm that represented the Transportation Commission of two counties. He stated that he could bring a "younger" perspective to the Planning Commission if appointed.

Paul Coates, 1710 Reynard (Planning Commission applicant/incumbent), stated that he has "passion" for the community and is willing to continue putting in the time to continue his seat on the Planning Commission.

Councilmember Kraus stated that he has been impressed with Eleno Núñez contributions to the community and recommends him for an appointment on the Community Resources Commission.

**Mayor Gingles** recommended the following appointments:

Pubic Works Director/City Engineer Takasugi reviewed the request for an APS on Lincoln Avenue and Washington Street; he provided a brief history of this item. He stated that Council declined the installation of an APS in May 2007 due to concerns from adjacent restaurants business owners regarding the noise caused by an APS. He stated that a petition signed by 100 citizens was submitted to Council in November 2007 followed by staff's request to Caltrans for approval of an APS signal at this intersection with the intent of finding low-volume APS solutions. He stated that staff recently received approval from Caltrans to maintain a low-volume APS provided that the City purchase it. He stated that notices for this item were sent to business in the 150 foot radius and no feedback was received.

City Manager McCann thanked Pubic Works Director/City Engineer Takasugi for pursuing and shepherding this project through.

14. Consideration of a Resolution approving the job classification and pay range for the Aquatics/ Recreation Manager position.

City Manager McCann introduced this item and stated that the Council discussed this proposed position at two previous meetings and formed a subcommittee (Councilmembers Slusser and Kraus) to work with him to fine-tune the draft classification and to bring the matter back for Council action. He stated that the subcommittee has made amendments to the job description and he also meet with the Community Pool Advisory Committee for their input.

**Councilmember Kraus** stated that this proposed position has more emphasis on aquatic programming which will be beneficial for the first year the pool is open. He stated this position will be a cost savings to the City.

Vice Mayor Dunsford stated his concern regarding placing more emphasis on aquatics than other recreation program.

City Manager McCann stated that the proposed position will oversee the entire recreation division and will have more emphasis on aquatics for the first year with the opening of the community pool.

Mayor Gingles stated the City needs to clearly identify the direction of the proposed position and how it relates to the existing recreation staff.

City Manager McCann stated that the existing recreation staff will continue performing their duties and will have a significant role in the aquatics programming; the proposed position will be focused on aquatics and overseeing and expanding the existing recreation programs.

**Vice Mayor Dunsford** stated that it is his understanding that City will seek someone for this proposed position that has substantial professional recreation and aquatic management skills and will provide ongoing training for the current staff.

City Manager McCann stated that the current recreation staff is supportive of recreation programming improvements and enhancing the recreation staff.
