Neal O'Hare, former Napa County Emergency Services Coordinator, complimented Ms. Brady on her involvement with past County and City emergencies and for her support provided to the local jurisdictions.

**Mayor Gingles** read Ms. Brady's proclamation and complimented her on her outstanding service to the City and the community.

 City Manager McCann stated that Ms. Brady was a key role in the City's flood emergency events during his past 11 years. He stated that she coordinated with other local jurisdictions in providing disaster training and she assisted with obtaining several grants for the City.

 Kathy Brady, Emergency Program Coordinator/Administrative Analyst, thanked Neal O'Hare, Mayor Gingles and City Manager McCann for their support. Consideration of a Zoning Ordinance Text Amendment, initiated by the City of Calistoga, to amend Chapter 17.22.040(A) Downtown Commercial (DC) District - Allowed, Conditionally Permitted and Prohibited Uses and 17.22.060(A) Community Commercial (CC) District - Allowed, Conditionally Permitted and Prohibited Uses of the Calistoga Municipal Code, to change review procedures for those use(s) located on property within an entry corridor, as defined in the 2003 General Plan Update, from a conditionally permitted use to a use permitted subject to administrative review with public notice.

Associate Planner Lundquist introduced this item.

Mayor Gingles open the public hearing.

Rex Albright, Executive Director of Calistoga Chamber, stated the Chamber supports this item in that it helps to strengthen new businesses and provides for business opportunities.

Mayor Gingles closed the public hearing.

**Planning and Building Director Gallina** stated that the Planning Commission has recommended that it is necessary to review and/or revisit this Ordinance six months after its codification to ensure the Ordinance is fulfilling its original intent.

9. Consideration of a Resolution establishing a Local Preference Policy for the sale or rental of affordable housing units that would give preference to income eligible households who live or work in the City of Calistoga.

**Mayor Gingles** stated that two communications have been received for this item; (1) Calistoga Realty and; (2) James Rose.

Senior Planner MacNab introduced this item regarding a proposed Local Preference Policy for affordable housing units being provided to those that live and work in the City. He stated that the first preference would be given to City staff because their services are required in times of emergencies; second priority would be given to applicants who live and work in the City limits; third priority would be given to applicants who live or work in the City limits; and the fourth priority would be given to all other applicants.

Mayor Gingles opened the public hearing.

Bob Fiddaman, Calistoga Affordable Housing President, stated his support for the proposed Local Preference Policy.

Rex Albright, Executive Director of Calistoga Chamber, stated that the Chamber supports the Local Preference Policy because it provides for community benefit and will support local business activity.

Mayor Gingles closed the public hearing.

**Councilmember Slusser** asked if the proposed policy can be applied to projects to which receive Federal and State funds.

Senior Planner MacNab responded that the preference can be applied except that there may be instances when the preference for City employees may not receive first preference for state or federally funded affordable housing projects; however City employees are not precluded from applying because they work in the City and many live in the City.

City Manager McCann stated that the Kaiser Marston Study was used in preparing the proposed Local Preference Policy and the four preference areas were used in fulfilling affordable housing opportunities in the City; federal and state agencies will give preference to City employees because they work/live in the City.

**Councilmember Kraus** stated that the Calistoga Joint Unified School District employees should be given preference because they provide emergency mutual aid to the City, and people who reside within the District's boundary should also be given preference.

 **Senior Planner MacNab** responded that research would need to occur before the proposed Policy could be expanded to include employees of the Calistoga Joint Unified School District and to include those that reside within the District.

Councilmember Slusser suggested that the City look into purchasing foreclosed residences as a way to increase the City's affordable housing pool.

City Manager McCann stated that the City's General Plan Housing Element (H-3) lists preferences and stated that the City could consider using funds to purchase foreclosure housing which would be guided by this policy.

Mayor Gingles read the communication provided by James Rose for the record.

**Planning and Building Director Gallina** stated that staff will explore the option of including the Calistoga Joint Unified School District employees and extending the boundary to include the District for the Local Preference Policy.

It was MOVED by Vice Mayor Dunsford and SECONDED by Councilmember Garcia to adopt the amended <u>Resolution No. 2008-114</u> establishing a Local Preference Policy for the sale or rental of affordable housing units that would give preference to income eligible households who live or work in the City of Calistoga. This policy will be re-visited by City Council within 60 days

Councilmember Kraus stated that it is his understanding that the Napa County Transportation and Planning Agency (NCTPA) Climate Protection Circuit Rider will be focusing on "green" issues within each jurisdiction.

Councilmember Slusser stated there needs to be one collective force to focus on green/sustainability issues.

City Manager McCann stated that the Community Resources Committee (CRC) was created to provide a forum for the discussion/consideration of various matters, one of which is environmental issues. He stated that the CRC is a good place to initiate study/discussions on green/sustainability issues. He stated that the CRC has formed a subcommittee with two of its members (Chris Henderson and Karen Chang) to assist with green/sustainability best practices and Associate Planner Lundquist is working with the NCTPA and other climate protection action groups to look at options on how to pool information together. He thanked Police Chief Mills for his assistance with the CRC.

It was MOVED by Mayor Gingles and SECONDED by Councilmember Slusser to adopt <u>Resolution No. 2008-117</u> approving the Community Resources Commission 2008/2009 Fiscal Year Work Plan. The Motion was carried as follows:

### 15. Consideration of a Resolution authorizing a performance bonus to City Manager.

 **Mayor Gingles** stated that City Manager McCann has not received a performance bonus in the last six years and is entitled to a five percent bonus and that the City Council has agreed that a 5% bonus should be granted. He stated that McCann has done an outstanding job and has offered to take only a 2.5 percent bonus given the current state of the local economy.

 Vice Mayor Dunsford stated that he appreciates McCann's sensitivity on the current local economic condition however he supports the full five percent bonus.

Councilmember Slusser stated that due to the tough economic times she is in favor of accepting the City Manager's offer to reduce the bonus by 50%.

**Vice Mayor Dunsford** thanked Mr. McCann and stated that he has been very valuable to the City and has built a good staff team which has greatly benefited the community.

**Councilmember Kraus** agreed with other Councilmembers that the City Manager has done a good job but with the difficult economic times he cannot support a bonus.

**Mayor Gingles** and **Councilmember Garcia** commented that they are comfortable with granting the bonus at the reduced 2.5% level.

It was MOVED by Vice Mayor Dunsford and SECONDED by Councilmember Garcia to adopt <u>Resolution No. 2008-119</u> authorizing a 2.5 percent performance bonus to City Manager. The Motion was carried as follows:
