SUBJECT:

Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement with Calistoga

Affordable Housing, Inc.

ISSUE: Consider a Resolution authorizing an amendment to a provision of the Professional Services Agreement with Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution.

BACKGROUND: It is common for private and public organizations to utilize consultant services for specialized work and to supplement full time staff capabilities. When the City of Calistoga finds such assistance appropriate, we execute a professional services agreement with the consultant. This agreement outlines the terms of employment regarding scope of work, compensation, and typical risk management liability matters. The agreement also includes standard language to limit the potential for conflicts of interest. This latter interest is accomplished in our agreements through the inclusion of a provision which prohibits the consultant from owning or having an interest in property in the City which might be affected by the work which is to be performed by the consultant.

DISCUSSION:

In the case of Calistoga Affordable Housing, Inc. (CAH), the City has contracted for a variety of affordable housing services. These services include general affordable housing policy assistance and advice relative to new and emerging housing practices and legislation as well as specific specialized assistance in the research and development of housing policies and regulations for application in Calistoga (see attached agreement). Presently, CAH is engaged in assisting the Planning & Building Department with work related to the Housing Element update. Their work will be in the form of base level research and compiling preliminary suggestions for aspects of the Housing Element update. It is important to note that the work from CAH will not be conclusive nor will it be a

stand alone product. Rather, CAH's role is to perform initial data gathering and to compile preliminary materials for the Planning staff who will then determine

through the public process the appropriate additions and changes to our policies. It is the Planning staff who will determine which policies and procedural recommendations will be brought forward for Commission and Council discussion and consideration.

CAH is a private non-profit organization with an affordable housing advocacy role as well as being an active developer of affordable housing projects. CAH presently owns and has financial or ownership interests in land in Calistoga. The professional services agreement includes a provision, Paragraph 6, Interest of Consultant, which prohibits such ownership in order to prevent the potential or appearance of a conflict of interest. This clash with this boilerplate provision was not recognized by the Planning staff or CAH until recently. Clearly, this conflict in the terms of the agreement must be reconciled.

There are a few options available for consideration:

- 1. Determine that the nature of the work in question pursuant to the scope of services in the agreement does not present the potential or appearance for a conflict of interest given the ownership interests present; or
- 2. Modify the agreement to permit CAH to carry on with their assistance but freely acknowledge that they have ownership interests in land within Calistoga; or
- 3. Amend the scope of services in the agreement to delete those services which might be more prone to conflict of interest concerns; or
- 4. Terminate the agreement.

Staff recommends the second option. This approach clearly daylights the situation and acknowledges the ownership interests of CAH and allows the City to retain and benefit from the valuable contributions from the organization as we move forward with our affordable housing efforts. Again, it is important to note that the services and products from CAH in regard to housing policy will be preliminary input to staff for consideration and use in developing formal staff recommendations to the Planning Commission during public meetings and ultimately recommendations to the City Council. Should Council find this approach to be acceptable, amendment to Paragraph 6 of the agreement will be in order.
