A) CALL TO ORDER - ROLL CALL

Mayor Canning called the regular session to order at 6:01 p.m.

In attendance were the following: Councilmember Gary Kraus, Councilmember Irais Lopez-Ortega, Councilmember Donald Williams, and Mayor Chris Canning.

Absent: Vice Mayor Michael Dunsford.

Also, in attendance: Public Works Director Michael Kirn, Administrative Services Director Gloria Leon, City Manager Dylan Feik, and City Clerk Irene Camacho-Werby.

B) SALUTE TO THE FLAG

Mayor Canning led in the Salute to the Flag and requested upon conclusion a moment for the victims of the mosque attacks in Christchurch, New Zealand.

C) ORAL COMMUNICATION ON CONSENT ITEMS OR NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Mayor Canning opened Oral Communication.

Kurt Larrecou, Calistoga resident, read and submitted a copy of a letter from the State of California Department of Health Services Drinking Water Field Operations Branch addressed to the City of Calistoga Planning and Building Department, dated February 16, 1996, regarding the proposed Development – Mt. Washington Cellars and Resort Village (copy on file with the Clerk's Office).

Following no further comments, **Mayor Canning** closed Oral Communication.

E) COUNCIL REQUESTS AND IDEAS FOR DISCUSSION

Councilmember Lopez-Ortega requested a future item, to receive an informational report on the Upper Valley Disposal & Recycling Center due to public concerns over potential contamination.

Mayor Canning, as the City's representative on the Upper Valley Waste Management Agency, responded to the concerns raised and informed Council that the agency is aware of the issues and are addressing them. In addition, the agency can provide formal reports, upon request.

Councilmember Kraus reported receiving complaints on the amount of debris located outside of the home on Grant Street which caught fire in December 2018, and recommended the complainants contact the City's Code Enforcement Department.

F) CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Feik reported on the following items:

Earlier today, on Highway 128 a propane hauler truck overturned, and both the Calistoga Fire and Police Departments provided emergency response. Napa and Sonoma Counties ordered an evacuation of the area, out of caution and used the Fairgrounds as an evacuation center. The Highway was re-opened.

The Council had recently approved the purchase of a new patrol vehicle for the Police Department and a new van for the Parks and Recreation Department which have been delivered and will soon be in use.

Following a previous presentation to Council on community microgrids, staff is currently working on a professional services agreement for scope of work and assessment to bring before the Council for consideration.

Mayor Canning reported the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is petitioning to shutdown additional zones that will affect the City.

1. Informational update on the AT&T Pathway project and Pioneer Park Pedestrian Bridge project.

Public Works Director Kirn provided an informational update on both the AT&T Pathway project and the Pioneer Park Pedestrian Bridge project.

Mayor Canning opened the public comment period.

Karen Chang, Calistoga resident, voiced concerns about the potential of future flooding.

Following no further comments, Mayor Canning closed the public comment period.

2. Presentation by Napa County District 4 Supervisor, Alfredo Pedroza on the activities of the Metropolitan Transportation Commission.

Mayor Canning introduced Napa County District 4 Supervisor Pedroza who reported on the activities and future projects of the Metropolitan Transportation Commission.

Mayor Canning opened the public comment period.
