90 Mayor Canning recommended that staff include in the FY 2019/20 91 Expenditures an estimate of \$30,000 to help the Calistoga Unified 92 School District with resurfacing the tennis courts used by residents. 93 94 95 Council and staff discussion ensued. 96 By Council consensus, it was recommended that staff include in the FY 97 2019/20 Expenditures an estimate of \$30,000 to assist the Calistoga 98 Unified School District with resurfacing the tennis courts. 99 100 During the report and discussion on Fire Services, Mayor Canning 101 proposed approving the recommended wage increases, per the Koff 102 Study, for the position of Part-Time Firefighter, effective on the City's 103 104 next pay cycle. 105 Council and staff discussion ensued. 106 107 108 By Council consensus, it was approved to accept the proposed wage 109 increases for the position of Part-Time Firefighter, effective on the City's 110 next pay cycle. 111 112 During the report and discussion on Police Services, Vice Mayor **Dunsford** recommended, temporarily, suspending the recruitment for 113 Police Chief until staff has had an opportunity to assess the needs of the 114 department with the needs of the City. 115 116 Council and staff discussion ensued. 117 118 By Council consensus, it was approved to temporarily suspend the 119 recruitment for Police Chief until an assessment for services has been 120 completed. 121 122 Mayor Canning clarified that exploring potential options to share 123 services with another jurisdiction will not be assessed for cost-saving 124 measures, it will be assessed for the betterment of the community. 125 126 127 Councilmember Lopez-Ortega stated that the commitment is to the community and serving their needs. 128 129 130 Administrative Services Director Leon invited Planning and Building **Director Goldberg** to report on the Development Impact Fee Estimates. 131 132 Council and staff discussion ensued. 133

134 135 The Council took a recess at 2:00 p.m. and resumed the Budget Study Session at 2:15 p.m. 136 137 Deputy Public Works Director Rayner presented on the Capital 138 Projects General Fund. 139 140 141 Council and staff discussion ensued. 142 Acting City Manager Kirn commended Administrative Services 143 Technician Harrison and Deputy Public Works Director Rayner on 144 their efforts to obtain various grants. 145 146 Acting City Manager Kirn provided Appendix A: Water Rate Study 147 Tables handout, from the City Water – Cash Flow Projections, 2018 148 Rate Study. 149 150 (Clerk's Note: Copy on file in the City Clerk's Office) 151 152 Council and staff discussion ensued. 153 154 155 Mayor Canning provided direction to staff to use the previously allocated funds of \$25,000 in the FY 2018/19 Budget towards a phase of 156 the Logvy Park project. 157 158 Discussion regarding the FY 2019/20 Budget continued. 159 160 Councilmember Williams stated he would like to consider providing a 161 162 rebate to water account customers and handed out a suggested draft Water-Rebate. 163 164 (Clerk's Note: Copy on file in the City Clerk's Office) 165 166 Council and staff discussed the suggestion and it was identified that the 167 enterprise funds are supposed to operate as independent cost centers, 168 without General Fund transfers. It was further noted that as proposed, 169 the water fund meets its bond covenants due to a \$255,000 subsidy from 170 the General Fund and that the water and sewer enterprise funds cannot 171 afford to issue rebates without increased support from the General 172 Fund. Any increase in General Fund subsidy could reduce funding in 173 other programs including the free recreation services and programs 174 provided to residents. 175 176

Mayor Canning proposed revisiting the topic when the enterprise funds 177 are self-sufficient and cover all operational and capital improvement 178 costs. 179 180 Mayor Canning proposed a closed session on Wednesday, May 15, 181 2019, at 5:00 p.m. to discuss public employment, recruitment for City 182 Manager.
