WHEREAS, during the January 20, 2009 City Council meeting, the City Council made clear that the City continues to desire Consultant's professional services as outlined in Section 1 of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS. City and Consultant desire to enter into this First Amendment to revise the Agreement as set forth in Attachment 1.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby authorizes the City Manager to execute an amendment to the Professional Services Agreement for affordable housing services with Calistoga Affordable Housing in substantially the same form as the agreement attached hereto for a contract amount not-to-exceed \$25,000 per year to be paid on a quarterly basis based upon services rendered.

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31	NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the following mutual promises, the

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34	1. <u>Section 1, Scope of Services</u> . The Scope of Work that is attached as
35	Exhibit A to the Agreement is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the
36	Scope of Work attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A-1.
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38	2. <u>Section 2, Time of Performance</u> . Section 2 is hereby deleted in its
39	entirety and replaced with the following: "The services of Consultant are to
40	recommence no sooner than, 2009 and, subject to City Council

41 approval, be completed no later than June 30, 2012. Any changes to these dates must be approved in writing by the City Manager or his or her designee."

- 3. <u>Section 3.B., Timing of Payment.</u> Section 3.B. is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following: "Payment for said services shall commence on ______, 2009 and shall be made quarterly. Consultant shall submit quarterly invoices, including cost records as necessary, to substantiate performance of the services described herein. Within 30 days after receipt of each such invoice, City shall verify the accuracy of the invoice and make payment to Consultant in an amount equal to the amount of such invoice.
- 4. <u>Section 6, Interest of Consultant</u>. Section 6 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following: "Consultant (including principals, associates, and professional employees) acknowledges that it possesses investments or interests in real property that may potentially be affected in some manner or degree by the performance of Consultant's services outlined in Exhibit A-1 ("Interest"). Consultant agrees that it will comply with all conflict of interest regulations of City and the State of California Fair Political Practices Commission, and will be solely responsible for any fines or penalties imposed by any regulatory authority, including the City that it may incur as a result of the Interest. Consultant agrees to provide to City, on an annual basis or upon new acquisition of investment or real property, a report detailing all ownership interests in real property in the City of Calistoga.

Consultant further warrants and represents that it is not a designated employee or public official within the meaning of the Political Reform Act because Consultant:

- (1) will conduct research and arrive at conclusions with respect to its rendition of information, advice, recommendation or counsel independent of the City, City staff, or any City official, and
- (2) possesses no authority with respect to any City decision beyond the rendition of information, advice, recommendation or counsel.

Consultant further warrants that it is a non-profit organization tax-exempt under section 501 (c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code and is presumed to not be operated for political purposes since it complies with the provisions of section 18217 of the Regulations of the Fair Political Practices Commission Title 2, Division 6, California Code of Regulations.

5. <u>Section 25, News Releases/Interviews</u>. Section 25 is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following: "All Consultant and subconsultant news releases, media interviews, testimony at hearings and public comment pertaining to the services rendered in subsections 2 and 3 of Section A under the Priority
